## **IFPD Makes Second Arrest in Wanted Man Hunt**

Idaho Falls Police arrested the second man who's been on the run from law enforcement since leaving the Bonneville County Sheriff work detail earlier this month.

Raymond Kyle, 20, was arrested Friday night for five outstanding Bonneville County warrants, including a warrant issued for felony grand theft, and obstructing and resisting an officer.

Kyle has been eluding police since April 5. He'd been considered armed and dangerous.

According to a police report, the IFPD received a tip that Kyle was at a residence in the 1500 block of Kearney.

Officers responded and located Kyle and his girlfriend in a crawlspace of the home. After refusing to come out after several requests by police, a K9 was sent into the crawlspace. Kyle and the woman again refused to come out and officers then used tear gas.

Both individuals eventually came out and Kyle was arrested.

## **I.F. Man Arrested on Felony Drug Charges**

Idaho Falls Police arrested a man early Sunday morning for two felony drug offenses.

Robert A. Flores, 32, was arrested for trafficking methamphetamine and possession of ecstasy, both felonies.

According to a police report, officers responded to a residence in the 100 block of Clubhouse Circle around 2 a.m. for suspicious activity. A resident reported that someone was opening and closing her front door and climbing onto her balcony.

Officers said during their investigation they spoke with the resident's son, Flores, due to his suspicious behavior. Flores' behavior lead to a search of the home.

They found 66.2 grams (approximately 2.33 ounces) of methamphetamine, one ecstasy pill and a large sum of cash in Flores' possession.

Flores was taken to the Bonneville County Jail.

### **I.F. Man Arrested for Felony DUI**

Idaho Falls police arrested Justin R. Abens, 28, of Idaho Falls Friday night for felony driving under the influence.

According to a police report, Officers arrested Abens during a traffic stop on Hitt Road after he failed field sobriety tests. Officers had probable cause that Abens was under the influence of prescription medication.

A blood draw was completed and Abens was taken to Bonneville County Jail. This is Abens third DUI arrest in 10 years.
