Five Cited for Reckless Driving in Road Rage Incident

Idaho Falls Police cited five drivers for reckless driving after a situation involving water balloons turned into a road rage incident.

Nicholas P. Graham, 18, Chelsey F. Shirley, 19, Jacob B. Blank, 21, Daniel J. Stillman, 21, and a 17-year-old male were all cited.

According to a police report, Graham and five juvenile passengers decided to fill water balloons and throw them at vehicles parked in the Common Cents parking lot at the corner of 17th and Holmes.

After the water balloons were thrown, a pursuit ensued and four vehicles chased Graham's vehicle south toward Bingham County. The drivers turned around at the county border and started driving back toward the downtown area.

During the pursuit, the four vehicles tried boxing Graham's vehicle in by striking it several times. There was an estimated \$8,000 in damage to all vehicles involved.

One of Graham's passenger reported the incident to police while the vehicles were still in pursuit of each other.

The five drivers were cited and the eight juveniles involved were released to their parents.
