

**DECEMBER 7, 1972**

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in a regular meeting, Thursday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 1972, at 7:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers in Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present at said meeting: Mayor S. Eddie Pedersen; Councilmen Jack Wood, Gil Karst, Paul Hovey, Norris Gesas, Jim Freeman, and Mel Erickson. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; John Evans, City Controller; Lorna Coughlin, City Treasurer; Rod Gilchrist, City Planner; Don Lloyd, Public Works Director; Ernie Craner, Parks & Recreation Director; Steve Harrison, Electric Engineer.

Minutes of the last recessed, regular meeting, held November 21<sup>st</sup>, 1972, were read and approved.

The Mayor invited Electrical Engineer Steve Harrison and Public Works Director Don Lloyd to escort, respectfully, Messrs. Ed DeRoche and Lee Lowe to the Council table. It was noted that, after ten years of service as City employees, these men had retired on November 30<sup>th</sup>, 1972. Speaking first to Mr. DeRoche as an employee of the Electrical Division and then to Mr. Lowe as Street Superintendent and, later, equipment management Superintendent, the Mayor commended these men on their years of dedicated service with the City. He then presented each of the men with an inscribed billfold and wished them well during their future years of retirement. These men then received a congratulatory handshake from all City officials around the Council table.

The Mayor, then noted that Mr. John Simpkins, although absent from the Council Chambers, was also entitled to an inscribed billfold, having been a City employee since 1946, first, for the Water Department and, later for the Parks Department. Mr. Simpkins retired as of September 30<sup>th</sup>, 1972.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place, as advertised, for a public hearing to consider three rezoning requests. First to be reviewed was the petition of Merlin W. and Eleanor B. Barnes as more specifically explained in this memo:

Attached is a copy of a rezoning petition submitted by Merlin W. and Eleanor B. Barnes requesting that the subject property be rezoned from R-1 to R-2A. The petitioner has stated that this request is being made due to difficulty in obtaining financing for single family residences on the subject property.

This petition was considered by the Planning Commission at their regular meeting November 14<sup>th</sup>, and at that time recommended denial of the request. This recommendation was made because of the fact that a similar petition had been considered in December 1971 and it was felt that sufficient evidence has not been submitted to warrant the Commission reversing its earlier decision. Also, a large number of protests have been received from adjacent property owners.

It is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

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The City Clerk drew attention to the fact that he had, in his portfolio, written letters of protest from the following: Mr. and Mrs. Joseph C. Braun, 350 Dale Drive; Mr. and Mrs. Bruce Staples, 291 Dale Drive; Mr. William Myers, 321 Dale Drive; Mr. Paul Anderson, 374 Dale Drive; Mr. Jay Young, 402 Dale Drive; Mr. & Mrs. Philip Nelson, 324 Dale Drive; Mr. & Mrs. Don Hood, 265 Dale Drive. Generally speaking, these letters of protest were premised on the grounds that any zone down grading of the property in question would add to traffic problems and would otherwise be detrimental to near-by residential property values. The City Clerk then presented a petition with 21 signers, protesting this proposed rezoning on the same grounds. These were mostly Dale Drive residents with some name duplications to the individual letters, referred to above. Finally, a similar petition of protest was presented with 105 signers, residents of Carmel, Camrose, Northview, Brentwood, Cypress, Avalon and Skyline. The Mayor directed the City Clerk to file these petitions in his office. Councilman Wood asked why this petition was presented. City Planner Gilchrist explained that the petitioner claimed that he was experiencing difficulty obtaining financing under an R-1 zone. Councilman Wood said that in his opinion, this was not sufficient justification to rezone. Neither the petitioner nor his authorized representative was present in the Council Chambers. It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Karst, that the Planning Commission recommendation be upheld, and this zoning request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, none; carried.

Attached is a copy of a petition to rezone submitted by Bill and Ada Kishiyama and John D. and Pam Bowen requesting the above described property be rezoned from R-1 to R-3A. The purpose of this rezoning is to provide the site for a new office for the Atomic Workers Credit Union.

The Planning Commission, at their regular meeting November 14<sup>th</sup>, considered this petition and recommended approval of the request. It is now being submitted to the Mayor and City Council for your consideration.

Mr. John Bowen appeared to explain that the proposed structure would be an attractive one story building, buffered by a parking lot. There were no protests. It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Karst, that this rezoning request be approved and the Building Official be directed to incorporate same on the official zoning map located in his office. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, none; carried.

Reference is made to page 279 in this book of minutes and, more specifically, lengthy open discussion relative to the Westgate Addition Division No. 1 final plat. It was noted that no Council action be taken at this time but, instead, the matter was tabled pending the results of one or more meetings between the developer and the near-by residents. In answer to a question by Councilman Wood, City Planner Gilchrist appeared to say that, in the interim period, meetings were held with reasonable success and, as a result, the developer was asking that the plat again be presented. Gilchrist said at least one problem was resolved as a result of said meetings; namely, that Mr. Storer had agreed, once the property was annexed, to immediately petition the Council for rezoning different from that previously recommended and more to the satisfaction of the near-by residents. Gilchrist said this would be limited to the northern portion of the property on which there were no immediate development plans. He said the only reason that time was of the essence for annexation was because of commercial development plans for the southern portion where there was no zoning controversy. Councilman Hovey again registered his dissatisfaction with the proposed plat on the grounds that through traffic on Hansen Avenue would be detrimental for the existing developed residential area on Hansen and other near-by streets. Hovey said the completion of Grandview would be the ultimate answer but that, if a through street were to become absolutely necessary before Grandview is constructed, the extension of Charlene would offer a more appropriate solution. Hovey said the very fact that the developer planned on constructing a truck service garage on Block 3 would suggest that there would eventually be more traffic and even truck traffic through the residential area to the north as an access to the Interstate. Hovey concluded his remarks by

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saying that, if this plat were approved as presented, there would be little incentive for any one to acquire or construct residential property within that affected area.

Mr. Dean Storer, one of the co-developers, appeared to say that there are expensive homes located all around this proposed development and that there was no reason to believe this trend would not continue. Storer continued by saying that, if the extension of Hansen did materialize he would recommend an eye-catching sign at West Broadway and Skyline directing traffic northbound to Highway 20; also, another sign on West Broadway at the entrance to Hansen indicating "No through traffic". In answer to a question by Councilman Erickson, as to how long the preliminary plat had provided for the extension of Hansen, Gilchrist said since about 1966. Hovey said this was no criterion as to how it should finally be accepted by the City. In answer to a question by a Councilman, Public Works Director Lloyd appeared briefly to say that, from an engineering and planning viewpoint, the extension of Hansen Avenue was needed and virtually essential. He said that no street, except for impassible barriers, were planned to dead-end at the boundary of any given development.

Mr. Willis Weichel, 795 Hansen Street, appeared briefly and confirmed the fact that the meetings between the developers and the residents were held. He said, after considering various alternates, it was agreed there was no other practical way but to extend Hansen Avenue. He said that he and his neighbors were reasonably pacified by the fact that Mr. Storer had agreed to proceed with the rezoning proposal.

Mr. Ron Bliss, 803 Hansen Avenue, appeared briefly to say he sees evidence, even now, of diverted traffic through a near-by parking lot to avoid the traffic light at Broadway and Skyline and that this is proof, in his opinion, that Hansen Avenue, if extended, would serve as a further diversion, adding to the traffic problem within the residential area.

In the absence of further comment, it was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Karst, that the final plat and the annexation agreement of the Westgate Addition, Division No. 1 be accepted and the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, one; carried; Councilman Hovey voting no.

**ORDINANCE NO. 1347**

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO

The foregoing Ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Karst, that the provisions of Section 50-902 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-902 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, one; carried. Councilman Hovey noting no. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, one; carried. Councilman Hovey voting no.

With regard to this newly annexed addition, it was moved by Councilman Wood, seconded by Karst, that it be initially zoned in the following manner: All lots except 9 and 10, Block 1, R2-A; Lots 1, 2 and 7 through 16, Block 2, R2-A; Lots 3, 4, 5, & 6, Block 2, HC-1, all of Block 3, HC-1. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; No, one; carried. Councilman Hovey voting no.

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The Building Official was directed by the Mayor to incorporate said zoning on the official zoning map, located in his office.
