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Dear Mayor:

Recently we invested a considerable amount in improving parking facilities at our establishment. We added an entrance on Capital between D & E Streets which establishes the proper direction in the parking lot so that all cars will be in the right position for existing in funeral processions. We also added asphalt, curbing and shrubbery for beautification.

We have found, however that most automobiles coming to our establishment usually enter our lot from E Street (the reverse) because it involves so much driving to get into the proper position to enter on Capital.

We therefore desire to petition the City of Idaho Falls to discontinue one-way traffic on Capital from (at least) C Street north to the end on G Street. We realize the value of our City having one-way streets and have no intentions of defeating its purpose. We feel that the major benefit of having one-way traffic on Capital lies in the congested area further south.

In discussing this matter with other occupants on Capital we have found that this reflects their desire also and they offered to sign a petition aimed at such a change should it be necessary.

Dear Mayor Pedersen:

This is in reference to your recent letter protesting the exclusion of rail lines in southern Idaho from the Basic System over which the National Railroad Passenger Corporation will have to provide passenger train service after May 1, 1971.

I know that you will recognize that the development of the Basic System was a most difficult task and that it was not practical to preserve the present system of rail passenger service without change. To do so would have placed the burden of a \$200 million annual loss on the National Railroad Passenger Corporation. Therefore, the Department established a Basic System which we believe is responsive to the need of a national intercity rail system and which has a reasonable chance to succeed.

The Idaho services affected are the Salt Lake City/Odgen to Butte and the Green River-Boise-Pocatello-Portland lines. On the Butte line, service is currently on a tri-weekly basis, and the trains (Union Pacific #35/36) average less than 30 passengers per train mile. At this less-than-busload level, a train cannot possibly cover its expenses.

On the Boise line, two trains now operate daily in each direction. One, known as the "Portland Rose," handles less than 30 passengers per train mile. While the latter is a more reasonable rider ship level, it still would not meet expenses in view of the fact that a train must not only pay for its direct operating costs, but for track and station expenses as well.

While we have not included these Idaho routes in the Basic System, routes in excess of the Basic System may be offered either at the option of the Corporation or at the request of State, local or regional agencies, provided such agencies agree to reimburse the Corporation for at least two-thirds of any loss incurred in the operation of such service.

We appreciate having your view.

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF A STREET WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; PARTICULARLY DESCRIBING AND LOCATING SAID STREET; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE. (TIGER AVENUE)
