

## DECEMBER 22, 1966

Attached you will find a list of utility accounts which, subject to your approval, it is our intention to charge off as un-collectable. This is in conformance with our annual policy, established several years ago.

You will note that these, without exception, have been on our books four years or longer and, therefore, are no longer legally collectable due to the statute of limitations. Also without exception, parties that constitute this list are a combination of deceased persons, bankrupts, "skips", or those without any known attachable assets or earning power. Even though these are charged off, the professional collector will continue to work on them. It is not at all uncommon to receive payments from this source on accounts as old as these.

As indicated, the list totals \$13,448.00 which is fractionally over .4% of the anticipated utility billing for 1966 of \$3,300,000. Your authorization to charge off these accounts is requested.

Overspend:

Transfer recommendations:
