

JANUARY 29, 1964

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Council Chambers of the City Building on the 29th day of January, 1964, at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of considering various items of business in need of Council action. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor S. Eddie Pedersen; Councilmen Page, Leahy, Nelson, Keller, Freeman, Parish. Also present: All Division Heads.

License applications for BARTENDER, Otis Sheperd, Joseph B. Krysty; NON COMMERCIAL KENNEL, Frank Prina; RETAIL LIQUOR LICENSE, White Horse Bar; RESTAURANT, LeBaron's Coffee Shop; FOUNTAIN, Skyline Drug; GROCERY STORE, Safeway #323; APPRENTICE GAS FITTER, Don W. Meppen; JOURNEYMAN ELECTRICIAN, Le Roy Collins, Enoch Weber, Alfred Holyoak; BEER, (transfer of ownership only) for James H. Ingelstrom were presented. It was moved by Councilman Page, seconded by Parish, that these licenses be granted. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried.

License application for CAB DRIVER, Arthur Hammer; HOTEL, Bonneville Hotel, were presented. It was moved by Councilman Nelson, seconded by Freeman, that these licenses be granted, subject to the approval of the Police Chief.

The City Clerk noted that, in the interest of time, he had published a legal notice without proper Council authorization, calling a public hearing on February 6th so that all persons interested in the City's estimated appropriation for this calendar year might be heard. It was moved by Councilman Parish, seconded by Keller, that this action be duly ratified. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried.

This memo from the Public Works Director was read:

January 28, 1964

Honorable Mayor and City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

Be advised that our sanitary landfill is operated by the use of a TD-20 international crawler-type tractor, mounted with a Drott front-end bucket. This machine is necessary to spread, compact and cover the refuse as it is brought to the landfill. This machine has been in continuous service since 1961.

Last year a complete overhaul was scheduled on this machine. However, due to circumstances at the time, the engine overhaul was all that was accomplished. It is now necessary to complete the repairs of the tracks and rollers. We anticipate this work should be done in our City Garage, and will require \$4633.18 worth of new parts as shown on the attached requisition. There is no question about the need for the major items checked on this list; additional small parts depend upon an inspection when the machine is dismantled.

We sincerely hope that this request will receive your immediate attention.

After a strong recommendation from Councilman Keller as to the need for these parts, it was moved by Councilman Nelson, seconded by Keller, that the request be approved and the Purchasing Agent be authorized to honor a purchase order accordingly. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 5; Leahy Abstained, carried.

Attention was drawn to the fact that the William Hatch property was the subject of zoning consideration during a public zoning hearing dated December 9th, 1963, that several nearby residents had appeared to protest the zoning as recommended by the Planning Commission and, consequently, zoning was tabled and referred back to the Commission for further study.

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Mr. Alfred Spano, 1535 Claire View Lane, appeared before the Council to report that the various protestants had agreed, after meeting with the Planning Commission, upon zoning which would be acceptable to all concerned parties.

The City Attorney had previously advised that in an instance of this kind, re-advertising and the holding of another public hearing is required. Therefore, it was moved by Councilman Leahy, seconded by Keller, that a public zoning hearing be scheduled for February 20th, 1964, and the City Clerk be authorized to publish notice accordingly. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried.

The Mayor proceeded to make the following Division Heads appointments: Luther I. Jenkins, Controller, H. P. (Pete) Hill, Airport Manager; Milton C. Jones, Police Chief; Donald F. Lloyd, Public Works Director. It was moved by Councilman Leahy, seconded by Keller, that these appointments be confirmed. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 6; No, None; carried.

The Mayor then declared the Meeting officially adjourned and that the balance of the time would be utilized by the Councilmen, working with Division Heads, analyzing requests for the 1964 budget, as prepared by Division and Department Heads.
