

JUNE 25, 1963

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Rogers Hotel in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, on June 25, 1963, at 1:00 P.M. for the purpose of awarding of bids on the South Yellowstone Highway water and sewer line, as well as any other business which might properly be presented. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Creek, Foote, Leahy. Absent: Councilman Page. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Vern Kidwell, City Attorney; Don Lloyd, Public Works Director; Luther Jenkins, City Controller.

An agreement was presented from the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company, as follows:

In connection with the application for Private Branch Exchange service this 10th day of June, 1963, it is understood that such service is subject to regulations of the General Exchange Tariff of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph.

The Private Branch Exchange equipment is furnished to the subscriber for an initial minimum period of 5 years in the same location, beginning the day following the installation date of the equipment. In the event the application for service is cancelled prior to complete installation or where the use of such equipment is discontinued or moved for any reason within the minimum period, termination, and/or other charges as provided in the General Exchange Tariff will be applicable.

It was understood that this agreement resulted from and incorporated the principal facets of a general study of the City's present and future telephone service needs as conducted by the Telephone Company, including capacity, number of outside lines, directory listings, separate lines and numbers, billing for long distance calls and switching equipment. It was understood, further, that the City's liability in this regard would be \$3,000.00 and that 20% credit per year would be allowed over a five year period. The above mentioned study by the Telephone Company, although not part of the agreement, would be attached to said agreement and placed on file in the office of the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Foote, seconded by Creek, that the agreement be approved and the Mayor be authorized to sign. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

Attention was drawn to bids, opened earlier this day, on the South Highway sewer and water lines, revealing the following:

After some discussion regarding the importance of the alternate bids, it was moved by Councilman Leahy, seconded by Foote, that the low base bid of Hartwell Excavating Company be accepted and the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract, when submitted. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

An agreement was presented from Grant B. Shippen, R. I. Clayton and Dean L. Wackerli as parties of the first part and the City of Idaho Falls as the party of the second part whereby the parties of the first part would agree to permit the party of the second part to extend a water line from one privately owned by them which extends to the Evergreen Gables Motel for water use at the newly constructed City owned park on the Snake River and, in exchange, the party of the first part would be permitted to connect the Green Gables Motel to the City sewer without fee or charge. It was moved by Councilman Creek, seconded by Leahy, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Leahy, seconded by Creek, that the Meeting adjourn. Carried.
