Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the District Court Room of the County Court House in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, on June 4, 1963, at 8:00 P.M. for the purpose of conducting a public hearing, relative to the intention to create and establish L.I.D. #31, a storm sewer district. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Leahy, Page, Foote. Absent: Councilman Creek. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; William Holden, City Attorney, representative; Don Lloyd, Public Works Director; Don Ellsworth, City Engineer.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place for a public hearing, as advertised, to hear and record written and verbal protests and other comments, pro and con, relative to the creation and establishment of a storm sewer district to be known as Local Improvement District #31.

The Mayor proceeded to say a few words of welcome and explained the background and the purpose of the hearing and finally, in the opinion of the administration, the need for the District.

He then introduced Public Works Director Don Lloyd who elucidated further, relative to the background of the District, how and why the problem originated, and the manner in which the City would attempt to solve same. Lloyd explained, further, that the storm drainage problem is City wide and that a study is being made to solve and correct the problem.

City Engineer Don Ellsworth then spoke and, by use of slides, depicted the existing sanitary system within the District and the proposed storm sewer to separate storm from sanitary sewage. He explained the outfall to the river and the proposed use of the Butte Arm of the Idaho Canal for a segment of said outfall. He concluded by explaining the costs of the District formation and the basis and method by which assessments were computed.

City Clerk Roy C. Barnes then spoke briefly and explained that, in the interests of time and with the concurrence of the Mayor, the Council and the City Attorney, it had been agreed that protests would not be read this night. He said 1383 signers had been received, either as written protestants or petition signers. He assured the group that all written protests and petitioners would be considered by the Council and would be retained in the office of the Clerk as part of the official record of this meeting. Although names of protestants and petitioners were not read, the Clerk was instructed by the City Attorney to list same in this Book of Minutes for the record. After eliminating all duplications, these names therefore, appear as a complete listing of those who presented written protests:

The Clerk then drew attention to two letters favoring the district. Although not read aloud at this protest hearing these were written by Mr. and Mrs. William Ginkel and Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Neece. Finally, presented through the City Clerk, this petition was read:

PETITION

If the required number of protests are not received eliminating the creation of Improvement District Number 31 and/or if the City Council decides to proceed with the work, regardless of the protests, proposed by creation of said district, we the undersigned property owners in Blocks 9 and 10, Brodbeck Addition, City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, hereby petition the Mayor and City Council to exclude us from the Improvement District Number 31 for the following reasons:

We have no need for special storm sewers and would derive no benefit whatsoever from construction of same.

If said District is created, it will place a large burdensome and inequitable assessment and expense upon the undersigned and their property and further, that any benefits, contended by the City, must be legally proven.

Verbal protests and other comments, pro and con, were then invited by the Mayor.

Keith Blackburn, 293 Westmoreland Drive: What percentage of protestants would be necessary to vote the district down?

Mayor O'Bryant: If two-thirds of the affected property owners protest, then three-fourths of the Council must vote affirmatively to approve the District.

Keith Blackburn: Does the City have definite authorization to use the Idaho Canal for storm water removal?

Mayor O'Bryant: No.

Arthur Mahood, 215 East 25<sup>th</sup> Street: The district is necessary, beneficial to the immediate area and the entire community and the cost must be borne equitably by all property owners within the area as all property owners benefit, to a degree.

Richard Smith, 915 South Higbee: Will all property, improved and unimproved, be assessed on the same basis?

Mayor O'Bryant: Yes.

Natalie Conley, 163 East 24<sup>th</sup> Street: As indicated by the original petition, immediate action is necessary and this particular area cannot wait for corrective action on a City-wide basis.

Don Bass, 140 E. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street: Would this project provide new and separate lines just for storm water? (Otherwise spoke favorably for the district)

Mayor O'Bryant: Yes.

John Bowers, 2305 Calkins: Proposed that those who have basement flooding problems permanently plug all basement drains.

John Latchum, 170 Lloyd Circle: The problem seemingly revolves around storm water emptying into sanitary sewers. Residents on Lloyd Circle do not contribute to this problem.

William Cole, City Sanitarian: Explained problem of running storm, water into dry wells and French drains.

A.W. Western, 234 E. 23<sup>rd</sup> Street: Sees no sanitary problem in running storm water into the ground.

William Cole: Running storm water into the ground is particularly dangerous in areas where drinking water is pumped from the ground.

Dr. John Casper, County Health Officer: The State Board of Health now has the right and authority to seal dry wells, which indicates the importance of this protective measure.

Carl Miller, 125 W. 21<sup>st</sup> Street: Regardless of the protective measures taken within the City, many dry wells will continue in use in the adjacent County areas.

Don Lloyd, Public Works Director: Reported 30% failures of all French drains installed during the last three years.

John Kaiser, 2370 Calkins: Rose Park has French drains and does not contribute to the flooding problem.

Lillian Gustafson, Sunnyside Road: The Gustafson Addition has natural drainage into the Butte Arm of the Idaho Canal. Do not feel that this area should be included in the district.

Dr. James McCue, 190 N. Morningside Drive: There have been no epidemics. There would appear to be no real problem except by a small minority.

Natalie Conley: Why include the Hughes Addition? Water in this area drains too slowly whereas water in the Brodbeck Area drains too fast.

F. R. Keller, 2847 Westmorland: Why is Hughes Imperial Addition included in the district?

Don Ellsworth, City Engineer: This area was contributing to the over-all problem. It is best to include all possible trouble areas when a district is being formed. It is simple to delete portions later, but impossible to add.

Earl Smith, 740 E. 10<sup>th</sup>: Why did the City pay for systems installed several years ago and property owners be expected to stand the expense of this district?

Mayor O'Bryant: Any systems not financed by a Local Improvement District was financed by the Developer.

George C. Petersen, Jr. 2833 Jolly Place: Feels drainage adequate in both Hughes Addition #1 and #2, and this area is not contributing to the problem.

Bob Stoddard, 900 Stanger Avenue: It would appear that the Engineering Department is not firm on their calculations or study, relative to this proposed district. Could assessments be increased without warning?

Lyman Perry, 245 E. 19<sup>th</sup> Street: Asked whether or not City was assessing itself for City owned property, including Tautphaus Park.

Don Ellsworth: Tautphaus Park does not contribute to the drainage of this area. There are certain City owned lots being assessed.

Lyman Pierce, 2845 Holly Place: There does not appear to be a satisfactory explanation as to why certain areas are included and others are excluded.

Jack Wursten, 2190 Calkins Avenue: If it is illegal to drain storm water into the ground then it's the City's responsibility to correct this problem.

Lloyd Cook, 1897 S. Higbee: Why segregate this area? It would appear that this is a City wide problem. \$1.50 monthly service charge should be sufficient.

Mayor O'Bryant: This service charge is for servicing the bonds, the interceptor lines and the treatment plant, all pertaining to the sanitary sewer system.

Lloyd Stalker, 177 4<sup>th</sup> Street: Why discriminate against the large lot? These do not contribute any more storm water than a small lot.

Mrs. W. J. Tupper, 2680 Fieldstream Lane: Sees no difference between this district and Highland Park where the property owner was not charged.

Kenneth Rasmussen, 661 E. 15<sup>th</sup>: Believes this project should have been resolved by an election. There is evidence of poor engineering. As an example, why don't the plans call for the storm water from the Martin Addition to be emptied into the canal which is close at hand?

Don Ellsworth: This would require a pumping operation.

Mr. Rasmussen: It would appear that this would still be a cheaper operation.

Paul Martell, 782 E. 15<sup>th</sup>: Proposed leaving the Martin Addition out of the district which would relieve the rest of the district. Also proposed that cost of storm sewer should be borne by all citizens of the City.

Max Huntsman, 1793 S. Emerson: The assessments seem exorbitant in relation to benefits.

Ed Reno, 635 E. 17<sup>th</sup>: Reminded the group that this project, when accomplished, would be for the health and general benefit of all.

John Meichle, 246 Short Street: Assessment exorbitant especially for a large lot.

R. H. McElhinny, 663 E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street: Does the Canal Company pay any costs of this project?

Don Ellsworth: Only for lots owned by them.

John Kaiser: Consideration should be given for all users, as well as property owners paying for the project by the month as is being done by the sanitary system.

Dora Blackburn, 293 Westmorland Drive: When schools and hospitals are considered, this is done by a vote of the people. This project should be handled similarly.

Lloyd Cook: The lines of this project must be installed in the street. This being the case, it won't be long before the same area is assessed again for street improvements.

Dr. Robert Butz, 190 E. 21<sup>st</sup> Street: This is a worthwhile project which should be accomplished now, rather than wait until it is forced by the State authorities.

Paul Martell: Would like to see percentage figures of those in dire need of this project in relation to those who are not.

Mrs. Ed Reno, 635 E. 17<sup>th</sup> Street: The more shut-off valves that are installed, the more wide spread becomes the over all problem.

Mrs. James CcCue, 190 N. Morningside Drive: Why not let surface drainage take care of itself and concentrate on the raw sewage.

Natalie Conley: It seems inequitable to charge on a square foot basis, especially vacant lots.

Hazel Rose, 229 E. 20<sup>th</sup> Street: Expressed appreciation to the Mayor and Council for their untiring efforts in the formation of this district.

Dr. McCue: Not beyond contributing to this project but it should be on a City wide basis.

John Conely, 163 E. 24<sup>th</sup>: Felt there should be separate consideration of the many problems; size and scope of the district, overall need, raw sewage vs. surface drainage, etc.

The Mayor then thanked the group for appearing and particularly those who expressed themselves. In the absence of further comment, he declared the Meeting adjourned.
