

SEPTEMBER 19, 1961

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Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Rogers Hotel on September 19, 1961 at 12:00 o'clock Noon for the purpose of considering the adoption of a resolution pertaining to the creation of Local Improvement District #27 and also an ordinance creating said district, as well as any other business which might properly be presented. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Foote, Page, Leahy, Creek. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; George Barnard, City Attorney.

The City Council having heretofore examined the proposal to create Local Improvement District #27, and having determined the actual value of the property of the proposed district to be \$2,750,000, and having determined the purposes of the creation of the district to be to provide necessary sanitary sewer facilities to properties in the district not now served by sewers, and having heard and disposed of all protests, it was therefore moved by Councilman Page, seconded by Creek, that the Council find that the proposal to create said district is in all respects proper, that the district will be for the best interest of the property affected in the City and that there is reasonable probability that the obligations of said district will be paid and that such findings be reported in the Minutes of this Council.

On roll call, the vote on the motion was as follows: Creek, Aye; Page, Aye; Leahy, Aye; Foote, Aye; Nay, None; carried.

The foregoing action having been taken, the ordinance creating Local Improvement District #27 was presented, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 1012

AN ORDINANCE CREATING LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 27 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; SETTING FORTH THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING THAT THE PURPOSE OF SAID DISTRICT IS TO PROVIDE SEWER SERVICE THEREIN; PROVIDING THAT SUCH IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE MADE AND THAT THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF SUCH DISTRICT AND THE IMPROVEMENT TO BE MADE THEREUNDER SHALL BE TAXED AND ASSESSED UPON ALL PROPERTY IN SAID DISTRICT IN PROPORTION TO THE NUMBER OF SQUARE FEET OF SUCH LOTS AND LANDS ABUTTING, ADJOINING, CONTIGUOUS AND ADJACENT THERETO INCLUDED IN THE BENEFITS DERIVED TO SUCH PROPERTY BY SAID IMPROVEMENT; FIXING THE POINTS BETWEEN WHICH SAID SEWER LINES ARE TO BE PLACED; SPECIFYING AND DESCRIBING THE LOTS AND LANDS WITHIN SAID DISTRICT WHICH ARE TO BE ASSESSED FOR SAID IMPROVEMENT; AND PROVIDING FURTHER THAT THE MAKING OF SAID IMPROVEMENT IS DEPENDENT UPON THE ISSUANCE

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AND SALE OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO  
DEFRAY THE ENTIRE COST OF SAID IMPROVEMENT.

The foregoing Ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Creek, seconded by Foote, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

The Council authorized the Chief of Police to send four of his men to Colorado Springs, Colorado to a National Pistol Shoot, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup>, 1961.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Leahy, seconded by Page, that the Council adjourn. Carried.
