

MAY 24, 1961

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Mayor's Chambers on Wednesday, May 24, 1961 at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of considering an agreement which would provide for the services of the International Association of Chiefs of Police in making a study of the Police Department. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Creek, Foote, Page, Leahy. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk.

The following agreement was presented:

AGREEMENT

This agreement, made this 22nd day of May, 1961, by and between the City of Idaho Falls, hereinafter called the City, and the Field Service Division of the International Association of Chiefs of Police of Washington, D.C., hereinafter called the Association.

WITNESSETH:

1. Association for and in consideration of the compensation hereinafter specified, covenants and agrees to conduct a survey and study of the organization, administration, training and records of the Police Department of the City.
2. Association will begin the survey on July 15, 1961, or as soon thereafter as is mutually agreeable to the City and the Association. The survey will proceed to completion with reasonable dispatch.
3. Association will prepare and deliver to the City fifty (50) copies of the survey report reflecting the results of the studies and making recommendations for improvements in systems and operations.
4. Association will conduct the survey at a cost of Fifty-Two Hundred (\$5,200.00) Dollars. Association will render a statement of the cost of the survey to the City following the delivery of the survey report.
5. City covenants and agrees to pay the Association, as compensation for its services, the costs and expenses incurred or expended by the Association in performing its obligations; but not to exceed the total sum of Fifty-Two Hundred (\$5,200.00) Dollars. City will pay the billing statement of the Association within thirty (30) days following its receipt.
6. So that Association may perform its part of this Agreement, the City agrees to provide Association with all information, access to files and records, and use of office facilities which may be necessary for Association to properly perform its obligations hereunder. For the purpose of decreasing the cost and accelerating the study, City agrees to furnish the services of one or more of its employees as may be necessary to gather and furnish data required by the

Association in its study. The City will provide motor vehicle transportation within the City of Idaho Falls as may be required to gather the data.

7. Neither the Association nor any employee of the Association participating in the survey will be deemed an employee of the City. The selection and designation of the personnel by the Association to participate in this survey shall be at the discretion of the Association and in all other respects the Association will act in the capacity of an independent contractor and shall not act under the direction or control of the City.
