

SEPTEMBER 30, 1960

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho met in Special Session in the Bonneville Hotel on September 30, 1960 at 12:00 P.M. for the purpose of considering various items of business which required Council consideration, prior to the next Regular Meeting. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Johnson, Creek, Foote, Petersen. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; George Barnard, City Attorney.

The Mayor presented a recommendation from the Citizens Highway Committee relative to East-West one way traffic as a means of relieving traffic congestion, as follows: West Bound, 4th Street and 9th Street; East Bound, 5th Street and 10th Street, all between Boulevard and Holmes; West Bound, Ash Street from Boulevard to Eastern Avenue, with supporting reasoning for their decisions. The same Committee also recommended that F Street be opened to connect with Yellowstone Highway and that a four lane underpass at D and Birch Streets be constructed as soon as funds are available and that negotiations with the Railroad and the State and Federal Highway Departments in connection with Yellowstone Highway widening include plans accordingly. The Council tabled any action on the foregoing at least until the next Regular Meeting.

It was noted that there are two parcels in need zoning or rezoning; namely Jennie Lee Addition #3 and the Highland Greenhouse Center. It was agreed that these be included in the next zoning hearing meeting to be held October 21st, 1960 and the City Clerk was authorized to publish notice accordingly.

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It was moved by Councilman Foote, seconded by Creek, that this be referred to the City Insurance Carrier. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

It was explained by the Mayor that Mr. Francis Stoddard is desirous of producing "South Pacific" at the Civic Auditorium within the predictable future and he has proposed that all profits over and above expenses be turned to the City. This matter was tabled by the Council with an expression that, in their opinion, it would be preferable for such a production to be sponsored by a local Civic Organization.

It was noted that Mr. Cecil Hart is no longer in a position to act as a member of the Traffic Safety Committee and upon Mr. Joe Call's recommendation the Mayor appointed Mr. Vincent Mullin to serve in his place. To this the Council concurred.

The Council authorized the Mayor to attend the Governor's Committee meeting for the Employment of the physically handicapped, to be held October 6th, 1960 at Twin Falls, Idaho.

The Mayor reported that the Building Official had recently advised and requested that the Junior High School Building plans be forwarded to the International Conference of Building Officials at Los Angeles, California for their inspection and approval, due to the fact that these are of unusual design. It was explained that the cost would be one half of the normal building permit fee. To this the Council consented.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn, carried.
