

DECEMBER 14, 1959

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Special Session in the Mayor's Chambers on December 14, 1959 at 11:30 A.M. for the purpose of considering certain matters which were tabled at the December 8th, 1959 Meeting, considering the creation of a position to be known as City Controller, and other business which might properly be presented. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor W. J. O'Bryant; Councilmen Foote, Petersen, Johnson, Creek. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; George Barnard, City Attorney; Max Humphries, City Auditor.

The Norris Hendrickson applications for five City licenses in the name of the Falls Cab Company and fifteen licenses in the name of the Yellow Cab Company were presented. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Creek, that these licenses be granted. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

The Fred Schmier application for a City license covering five taxi cabs in the name of Falls Cab Company was again presented. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Creek, that the application be denied on the grounds that licenses for twenty cabs, the legal limit have already been approved. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

A request from the Idaho Falls Armory Association, presented at a previous meeting, was again aired, relative to whether or not credit could be allowed that organization to apply on rent, for heating equipment which they had installed in the armory building. It was agreed to permit \$900.00 to be so credited, covering their rent to the City from July 1st to December 31, 1959.

The Homer Koster letter and request, presented at the December 8th, 1959 Meeting was again reviewed. It was moved by Councilman Foote, seconded by Creek, that the City bear its share of the cost between a sixty and an eighty foot street as indicated, in the amount of \$5,911.65, said expense to be budgeted item in next years fiscal period. It was made clear that any such comparable request of the future must be considered on its own merit and must be duly presented to the Council for their consideration. Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Foote, Johnson, Creek; No, Councilman Petersen, carried.

The Milk Ordinance was again presented. It was suggested that this receive special publicity between now and the next Council Meeting and that if there are no protests, criticism or objection it might well be passed on its third reading at the next Council Meeting.

The Mayor reported that Mr. Robertson Smith, Executive Secretary of the Idaho Municipal League, will be in the City on December 21st and has asked to meet with all City Officials of this City and others in the Community relative to matters of a legislative nature that should be studied. To this the Council agreed.

The Mayor brought up the question as to whether or not the Council felt ready to approve the construction of a culvert across a canal which would lead into a street yet to be dedicated in the Bennett Ferguson Subdivision, said street of which would serve to connect Waid Street and Lincoln Road. The Council gave their approval to the construction of the culvert.

The subject of a City Controller was presented. It was moved by Councilman Creek, seconded by Johnson, that the City Attorney be instructed to draft an Ordinance creating the position. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

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Subject to the passing of the Controller Ordinance, the Mayor appointed Mr. George Aupperle to the position of City Controller and Mr. Boyd Wright to the position of Purchasing Agent. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Creek, that these appointments be confirmed. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn, carried.
