

APRIL 30, 1959

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council met in Special Session in the Mayor's Chambers on April 30, 1959, at 2:00 P.M. for the purpose of officially canvassing the ballots from the second General Municipal Election, held April 28th, 1959, and any other business which might properly be presented. Gentlemen:

This letter is written with regard to the training of City personnel for work in the newly formed Sewage Works Department.

About three years ago Mr. Jerry Cottrell started concentrated study in sewage treatment. For the past two years the City has authorized Mr. Cottrell's expense in spending approximately one week in the Boise-Nampa-Caldwell area to work with and train under the supervisors of these treatment plants. Our City now has laboratory equipment on hand, and Mr. Cottrell is requesting another week in the same area to review laboratory methods and analysis prior to starting tests here with our own equipment.

In addition to this, our City is in need of new sewer maintenance equipment. In each of the cities mentioned, different equipment is used and it would be to our advantage to observe and work with the crews in each of these cities in order to obtain the best possible quality for our particular needs. Mr. Raymond Collins, of the Sewer Department is the likely successor to the sewer maintenance foreman, and is well qualified to judge the worth of this equipment.

It has been estimated that the total cost to the City would be \$125.00 for the expenses of these two men to make this trip. Further, if one man were authorized, the expenses would be reduced about \$30.00. Because of the work schedule outlined for the next few weeks, it will be necessary to make this trip within the next two weeks.

It is the recommendation of this Department that consideration be given for the authorization of this schooling for the benefit of the Sewerage Works Department.

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 29, Title 50, Idaho Code, and by deed of the City Treasurer dated this 1st day of September, 1958, recorded in Book 116 of Deeds at Page 289, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to and possession of the following described real property, to-wit:

It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that this tally on election results be accepted as being correct and adopted as the official vote count. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried. (SEE COUNCIL MINUTES DATED 5-7-59 FOR CORRECTION ON THIS MATTER. R.C.B.)

The Mayor presented for Council reconsideration the question as to whether or not the City should obligate itself to reimburse Frontiers Construction Company on an access trunk line sewer to the Falls Valley subdivisions and other subdivisions in the area. This was originally presented at the February 20th and March 9th, 1959 Meetings. Councilman Johnson and Petersen expressed their views in opposition to said reimbursement, taking into consideration the time element of the installation in relation to the time element that the City started collecting hook on fees, recognizing that future requests from these or other people on similar installation might well receive favorable consideration. The Mayor entertained a recommendation that as, if and when the Shippen & Barnes case is settled, which will be after the new administration is in office, the subject might again be presented and reviewed. To this the Council concurred.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Foote, that the Council adjourn; carried.
