

MARCH 9, 1959

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in recessed session Monday, March 9, 1959 at 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor John B. Rogers; Councilmen Foote, Petersen, Johnson. Absent: Councilman Freeman. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Alva Harris, Building Official; Don Lloyd, City Engineer; Don Ellsworth, Assistant City Engineer; George Aupperle, Assistant Purchasing Agent.

The Minutes of the last Regular Meeting held February 20<sup>th</sup>, 1959 were read and approved.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place to register protests on areas scheduled for rezoning, as advertised in the Post Register February 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, and March 1<sup>st</sup>, 1959. He asked first for protests on the Page petition asking a change of zoning from R-1 to HC on the following legally described property:

The South 300 feet of the following described tract: Beginning at a point that is North 0° 13' West, 30.0 feet and North 89° 58' East 346.0 feet from the Southwest corner of Section Thirteen (13), Township Two (2) North, Range Thirty-seven (37) East Boise Meridian, said point being on the Easterly bank of an irrigation ditch, and running thence along said irrigation ditch North 2° 58' East 189.0 feet, thence North 12° 11' East 29.6 feet, thence North 26° 01' East 24.03 feet, thence North 34° 54' East 106.2 feet, to a point on the Southerly bank of said irrigation ditch, thence South 0° 10' 30" West 326.5 feet, thence South 89° 58' West 86.5 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.50 acres, more or less.

Mr. Dave Klingenberg, West Highway, appeared before the Council representing himself and Oscar Garrett, protesting the rezoning on the grounds that the change would provide the basis for improvements too noisy and otherwise unsuitable for the close neighbors. His property adjoins that of Mr. Page. He wasn't too concerned when he learned the plan was for the erection of a business building or something comparable but still went on record as registering a protest. There were no other protests, verbal or written.

Next to be considered was the Clark petition asking for a change of zoning from R-1 to R-3 on the following described property:

Beginning at a point on the Section Line North 89° 07' 30" West 85.00 feet from the Northeast Corner of Section 20, Township 2 North, Range 38 East Boise Meridian, Bonneville County, Idaho, and running thence North 89° 07' 30" West along the Section line 206.00 feet; thence South 0° 37' 30" East 3827 feet more or less to Idaho Canal R/W line, thence North 36° 04' 30" East along said canal R/W line 235.7 feet; thence North 25° 40' 30" East along said canal right of way line 99.2 feet; thence North 11° 17' 30" East along said R/W line 101.7 feet more or less to the point of beginning.

There were no protests, verbal or written.

Next to be presented was the Smith and Pond petition, asking for rezoning from R-1 to HC on the following described property:

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Beginning at a point 27 feet South of the Northwest corner of Section Twenty-four (24), Township Two (2) North, Range Thirty-seven (37) East Boise Meridian running thence East 325 feet; thence South 300 feet; thence West 325 feet; thence North 300 feet to the point of beginning.

There were no protests, verbal or written.

Next up for consideration was the Groberg, Holm and Hall petition asking for rezoning from R-1 to R-2 on the following described property:

Lot Three (3), Block One (1); and Lot One (1), Block Two (2) and the North Ten (10) feet of Lot Two (2), Block Two (2) Edgemont Gardens Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, County of Bonneville, State of Idaho.

There were no protests, verbal or written.

The last request for rezoning was that of Ben Brothers, asking for rezoning from R-1 to HC on the following described property:

Beginning at a point that is 31.7 feet South 0° 16' East of the Northwest Corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NE ¼ NW ¼) of Section Twenty-four (24), Township Two (2) North, Range Thirty-seven (37) East Boise Meridian, and running thence South 0° 16' East 311.6 feet; thence East 208.5 feet; thence North 0° 16' West 311.6 feet; thence West 208.5 feet to the point of beginning.

There were no protests, verbal or written.

Mr. Oscar Mai, 755 Saturn, and Mr. Robert P'pool, 784 Saturn Avenue acted as co-spokesmen for a group of Temple View residents, asking when action against the Bird Trailer Court could be expected. It was explained that this must be done by Civil Action on the grounds that a contract has been breached and that they could be assured that this is on the agenda of the City Attorney.

Mr. Eddie Petersen and Mr. Reed Williams appeared before the Council representing the Chamber of Commerce sub-committee on recreation. Mr. Williams acted as spokesman. A proposed ordinance was turned over to the Council for their study and Mr. Williams discussed its salient points. He then discussed the recreational program of other cities in the area in relation to Idaho Falls. The following resolution was presented:

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
OF THE IDAHO FALLS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE (Resolution No. 1959-02)**

WHEREAS, the Recreation Committee of the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce, after deliberate study of the existing recreation facilities of the recreation program provided by the City of Idaho Falls, has recommended that an ordinance be adopted by the Mayor and City Council of Idaho Falls providing for the establishment of a Recreation Commission, to plan and study the economic and technical conditions and problems in connection with the

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operation, management, regulation and control of playgrounds and recreational facilities in Idaho Falls.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Directors of the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce, approve said recommendations of the Recreation Committee and urge the Mayor and Councilmen of Idaho Falls to adopt such an ordinance as recommended by the Recreation Committee of the Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce.

The Mayor assured the group that the ordinance and the project would be given every Council consideration.

The City Clerk asked for Council ratification for the Mayor's authority in instructing the City Clerk to include in the February 20, 1959 Minutes the portion of said Minutes pertaining to the Council's previous action with regard to reimbursing Frontiers Construction Company for the cost of a sewer trunk line from First Street to 9<sup>th</sup> Street out of sewer hook on charges, etc. Instead, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that this be rescinded and stricken from the minutes. **RESOLUTION (Resolution No. 1959-03)**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO:**

**Section 1.** That a General Municipal election is hereby called pursuant to law to be held in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, on Tuesday, April 7, 1959, for the purpose of electing a Mayor for the term of two years and two Councilmen for terms of four years each.

**Section 2.** That the polls at said election shall be open at the hour of 9 o'clock A.M. and remain open continuously until the hour of 7 o'clock P.M. and then closed. Said election shall be held at the voting places set forth in Section 4 hereof.

**Section 3.** That all persons, who at the time of election, are qualified electors of the City, properly registered and possessing the qualification of residents shall be qualified to vote at said election and the ballots to be used at said election shall be in the form set forth in Section 50-3715, Section 50-3716 and Section 50-3717, Idaho Code.

**Section 4.** That notice of said election shall be given by the City Clerk by publication of the following notice in at least two issues in the Post Register, a daily, except Saturday newspaper printed and published in the City of Idaho Falls; the first of which publication shall

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be made not less than twenty (20) days previous to the date of said election; and the City Clerk shall give further notice of said election by posting said notice at each voting place to be used at said election and at two other public places in each precinct in said City for not less than twenty (20) days previous to said election. Said notice shall be in the form and shall contain the information as follows: to-wit:

**NOTICE OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION**

Pursuant to the laws of the State of Idaho notice is hereby given that a General Municipal Election shall be held in the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho, at the voting places hereinafter designated on Tuesday, the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1959, beginning at the hour of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and closing at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P.M. of said day, for the purpose of electing a Mayor for a term of two years and two Councilmen for terms of four years each.

Notice is further given that only qualified electors of said City and who are registered as provided by law are entitled to vote at said election. No qualified electro who is duly registered as a voter in the last preceding General Municipal Election shall be required to register so long as he remains, or has remained, continuously after such registration, a duly qualified elector of the City of Idaho Falls; provided, after any qualified elector has reregistered, and has failed to keep his continuous residence and full qualifications to vote in said City, regardless of how short the term of his disqualification shall exist or have existed, he shall not be entitled to vote at such election after such disqualifications shall exist or have existed, he shall not be entitled to vote at such election after such disqualification existed, unless he shall have reregistered for the election at which he next desires to vote. If such elector shall have removed to another precinct within the City, he or she shall notify the City Clerk of such change of address and such Clerk shall register him of her in the precinct to which the elector shall have removed.

Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk, is the Ex-Officio Registrar of said City. The places of registration are the Office of said City Clerk in the City Building and the respective residences aforesaid of the said deputy registrars.

Persons may register on each day of any time during the office hours of said City Clerk, beginning with the day the Notice of Election is given and continuing until and including Saturday next preceding the election; and on Thursday, Friday and Saturday next preceding the election, persons may register between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and 5:00 P.M. and between the hours of 7:00 o'clock P.M. and 9:00 o'clock P.M.

The voting at said election shall be by ballot. The ballot to be supplied the voters for their use at said election shall be substantially as provided by Section 50-3715, Section 50-3716, and Section 50-3717 Idaho Code.

In accordance with your instructions, we are investigating the sand problem that was prevalent in the Central Park Well in the last irrigation season.

Before requesting authorization for any sizeable expenditure, we are testing the well now for sand production. On Friday, about 30 minutes of pumping produced no evidence of sand at 80 pounds pressure and 4100 gallons per minute discharge.

This week it is our intention to run the well full capacity and keep constant check for said sand production. This Department will make specific recommendations at the conclusion of the pumping test.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your instructions, we have investigated the possibility of providing the 17<sup>th</sup> Street Improvement from Boulevard to Emerson.

The design was reviewed and the cost estimate prepared for the earth work involved in moving the canal to the north. This cost is estimated at approximately \$15,000.00 not including the surfacing of the additional 20 feet of 17<sup>th</sup> Street.

We find, however, that in discussing this proposed improvement with Mr. Dave Dick, Manager of the Idaho Irrigation District, that the Canal Company would not consider approval of an embankment construction. It is his feeling that a continuous conduit will be mandatory before he would give approval. There is every possibility that this difference of opinion could be worked out in time, but it is felt that agreement could not be reached in time for construction prior to the irrigation season.

It would be appreciated if the Council could instruct this Department on the course of action desired.
