

FEBRUARY 11, 1959

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council met in Special Session in the Mayor's Chambers on February 11, 1959, at 2:30 P.M. for the purpose of: considering a proposal from Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, through their Boise representative, Earl Reynolds, for a long range master plan for the City water system. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor John B. Rogers; Councilmen Foote, Petersen, Johnson, Freeman. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; Earl Reynolds, Engineer; Don Lloyd, City Engineer.

The Mayor presented a problem which has arisen relative to the Jack Adams long term lease with Bowl-ero Corporation, on the anticipated bowling alley site just east of Albertsons on First Street. Mr. Adams now insists that, prior to signing the lease, the City must pave or cause to be paved the east side of Olive Street between 2nd and 4th Streets. The bowling alley group has offered to do this, including curbs, gutters and sidewalks. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Foote, that permission be granted accordingly and that the City of Idaho Falls be permitted to enter into a contract with Mr. Adams to this effect. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

Mr. Earl Reynolds, Boise representative of the engineering firm of Cornell Howland, Hayes & Merryfield, appeared before the Council at the request of the City Engineers, with a proposal from that firm pertaining to a long range master plan for the City water system. The salient points of this proposal included: Determining the physical condition of the existing system; establishing the capability of the present system; determining supply, based on anticipated new growth; establishing proper pipe sizes for maximum efficiency; possibility of metering from the dual standpoint of economy and supply preservation; feasibility of storage including a reservoir located on the nearby foothills.

Such a survey would cost the City approximately \$8,500.00. No action was taken and the Council thanked Mr. Reynolds for his appearance and advised that he would be advised at a later date their decision on this project.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn, carried.
