

DECEMBER 1, 1958

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council met in Special Session in the Mayor's Chambers on December 1, 1958, at 2:00 P.M. for the purpose of considering what action should be taken with regard to Freeman Avenue between First and Second Streets, now owned by Jack Adams. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor John B. Rogers; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, Johnson, Absent: Councilman Petersen. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk.

Councilman Freeman reported on his various interviews with Mr. Kent Naylor, local attorney, who is representing Mr. Jack Adams in this regard and said that it was Mr. Naylor's advice that the first step is to make a reasonable offer to Mr. Adams. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Freeman, that the City offer, in exchange for the land involved, to place curb, gutter and paving on Freeman Avenue between First and Second Streets. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Foote, that the Council adjourn; carried.
