Pursuant to a call by the Mayor the City Council met in Special Session in the Council Chambers on Monday, at 8:00 P.M. July 7, 1958, for the purpose of opening sealed bids for Phase I of the interceptor sewer project. Present: John B. Rogers, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Freeman, Johnson, Petersen. Absent: None. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Don Ellsworth, Assistant City Engineer; Earl Reynolds, and Don Lloyd of the Engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes, and Merryfield.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place for the opening of sealed bids for Phase I of the interceptor sewer project and instructed the City Clerk to proceed accordingly. Five bids were presented and revealed the following:

Kloepfer Construction Co.	Logan, Utah	\$372,139.44
Intermountain Company	Boise, Idaho	459,664.54
Pickett and Nelson	Idaho Falls, Idaho	472,239.87
Universal Pipeline	Kansas City, Missouri	727,526.54
Statewide Heating	Murray, Utah	665,347.65

The Mayor then advised those present that all bids would be reviewed by the Engineering Department and the successful bidder, when selected, must be approved by the Public Health Service in Boise. He said it was hoped that the successful bidder could be announced within the next ten days.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn. Carried.
