

MAY 8, 1958

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Recessed Session Thursday, May 8th, 1958, at 10:00 A.M. in the Council Chambers. There were present at said Meeting: John B. Rogers, Mayor; Councilmen Petersen, Freeman, Johnson. Absent: Councilman Foote. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk.

The Minutes of the last Regular Meeting held April 18, 1958 and a Special Meeting held April 30, 1958 were read and approved.

Mr. Scott Williams, Solar Electric Heating Company, appeared before the Council requesting a permit for installing electric heating in residences. He indicated the Company has the professional knowledge, the material and the equipment for proper and safe installation. The Council approved the issuance of the permit, subject to the approval of the Distribution Superintendent and the Mayor agreed to discuss the matter with him.

Mr. Joe Anderson, Local Attorney, appeared before the Council representing the Local Home Builders Association and asked a question with regard to sewer hook on charges and what it covers. It was suggested that he meet with Mr. Earl Reynolds who was scheduled to be in town May 9th, 1958.

Mr. Anderson then referred to the Boise Cascade petition and ordinance which was originally presented to the Council February 21st, 1958. Mr. Anderson stated that, as per the Council's request, a proper easement had been prepared and executed by the Boise Cascade Corporation. Mr. Anderson was given the assurance that if the City Engineer verified that everything was in order, the vacating ordinance could be considered to be in effect, subject to its publication.

Mr. Sterling Cannon, local realtor, appeared before the Council and asked that, with regard to the sewer bond issue, could any funds not actually used from that source be earmarked for additional sewer lines not covered by the present project. He was answered in the affirmative but, it was explained, new bids would be necessary.

The bills against the City for the month of April, 1958, having been audited by the Finance Committee, were presented by the City Clerk for payment as follows, to-wit:

This had been originally presented February 21st, and was tabled pending receipt of an investigation by the Chief of Police which has since been received. Gentlemen:

After considerable discussion with our Engineer and the City Engineer we propose the vacation of the following described property:

Beginning at the extreme south corner of Lot 1, Block 5, Linden Park Addition, Division No. 1 as shown on the recorded plat thereof and running thence S. 27° 07' W. 180.00 feet; thence S. 0°16' E. 84.03 feet; thence S. 62°53' E. 87.14 feet; thence S. 27°07' W. 138.05 feet to a point on a curve with a radius of 16.76 feet; thence to the right along said curve a distance of 44.64 feet; thence N. 0°16' W. 450.89 feet to the extreme west corner of Lot 1, Block 5 of said Linden Park Addition; thence S. 62°53' E. 113.24 feet to the point of beginning.

This and the adjoining property will be used by the Congregationalist Church for a church building and church lawn, park, etc.

It will probably be advisable to move the hydrant out of the middle of the area onto the edge of Lincoln Drive. It will also be necessary for us to give back an easement for the water and sewer lines which run across the point end of this property.

We believe this request is in keeping with good planning and the proper use of this land.
