

APRIL 30, 1958

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council met in Special Session in the Council Chambers on April 30, 1958, at 2:00 P.M. for the purpose of again considering a Trailer Ordinance, discussing the possibility of a notice of public hearing of rezoning of City property bounded by 1st Street, No. Yellowstone and Holmes Avenue, getting Council approval to the Mayor's signature on two City owned farm property leases and discussing the local bus franchise. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor John B. Rogers; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, Petersen. Absent: Councilman Johnson. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Alva Harris, Building Inspector; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; Claud Black, City Engineer.

Mr. Harris requested Council action so that his Department will know where they stand in connection with the growing demand for trailer space on City lots. It was agreed to amend the new Trailer Ordinance which has been passed on two readings to prohibit trailers in R-P, R-1, and R-2 zones, plus other minor changes and the City Attorney was instructed to proceed accordingly.

ORDINANCE NO. 907

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, OPERATION AND ALTERATION OF TRAILER COURTS AND TRAILER HOUSING WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF TRAILER COURTS AND TRAILER HOUSING; ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR SUCH LICENSING, AND THE AMOUNT OF THE PERMIT FEES; PROVIDING FOR INSPECTIONS OF TRAILER COURTS AND TRAILER HOUSING; PROHIBITING TRAILER HOUSING IN R-P, R-1 AND R-2 RESIDENCE ZONES; DEFINING THE TERMS HEREOF; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

The foregoing Ordinance was read in title. It was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Freeman, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

The Council instructed the City Attorney to draft a notice of public hearing for rezoning of the triangle bounded by First Street, No. Yellowstone and Holmes Avenue, and the City Clerk upon its receipt, to publish same.

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The Mayor presented two leases covering City farm land at the Airport and Fielding Memorial Park. It was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Foote, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the leases. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

The City Engineer reported that the School Board, through their architect, has requested the City to install a 320 foot, 6" water line to the new school below 17th Street and west of St. Clair Road. It was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Freeman, that the request be denied. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

It was brought to the attention of the Council that the local City Bus Company is operating in conflict with their franchise, due to the absence of public liability insurance. It was moved by Councilman Foote, seconded by Freeman, that the franchise be declared void and a "cease operations order" be issued. Roll call as follows: Ayes, 3; No, None; carried.

There being no further business, it was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Foote, that the Council adjourn. Carried.
