

JANUARY 13, 1958

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council met in Special Session in the Council Chambers on Monday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, 1958, at 2:00 P.M. for the purpose of opening sealed bids for the Capitol Hill Well Improvement. Present: Mayor John B. Rogers; Councilmen Foote, Freeman, Johnson, Petersen. Absent, none. Also present: Roy Barnes, City Clerk, Claud Black, City Engineer; Arthur Smith, City Attorney.

The Mayor announced that this was the time and the place for the opening of sealed bids on the Capitol Hill Well Improvement and instructed the City Clerk to proceed accordingly. Two bids were presented as follows, to-wit:

Wintroath Pumps	1100 South Meridian Ave., Alhambra, Ca. with a local branch on South Highway	\$14,990.00
Nickerson Pump & Machinery	158 West 4 <sup>th</sup> South Street, Salt Lake City, Ut.	14,470.00

The foregoing bids were referred to the City Engineer and the Water Committee for their recommendations.

Discussion continued on the amended Gas Ordinance. City Attorney Smith advised that the clause pertaining to the number of apprentices any one contractor could hire is, in his opinion, border line in nature from a legal standpoint and one on which the Councilmen should determine policy. It was finally decided to delete from the Ordinance the amendment pertaining to the subject, with the understanding that the ordinance be strictly adhered to and enforced with reference to the apprentices being at all times under the direct supervisions of a journeyman. The following caption, then, represents the Ordinance with all the previously discussed changes with the exception of this one which has been deleted.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROMOTE THE SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE PEOPLE OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, BY REGULATING THE DESIGN, INSTALLATION MAINTENANCE, IMPROVEMENT, AND INSPECTION OF GAS INSTALLATIONS, OF GAS PIPING AND OF GAS APPLIANCES IN BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES, DEFINING THE TERMS THEREOF; ESTABLISHING MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS AND SAFETY STANDARDS FOR GAS INSTALLATIONS AND PIPING; REQUIRING WORK PERMITS AND SPECIFYING REGULATIONS THEREFORE; REQUIRING INSPECTION OF ALL WORK AND INSTALLATIONS; REQUIRING LICENSING OF ALL PERSONS INSTALLING OR WORKING ON GAS PIPING AND APPLIANCES; SETTING UP CLASSIFICATIONS AND REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO LICENSING; REQUIRING BONDING AND INSURANCE CERTIFICATES FOR LICENSEES; ESTABLISHING AN EXAMINING BOARD, PROVIDING FOR ITS DUTIES AND SETTING FORTH REGULATIONS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR

VIOLATIONS; SETTING FORTH A CONSTITUTIONAL DECLARATION; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

It was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Johnson, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried. The majority of all members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PAS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn, carried.
