

MAY 10, 1957

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in a Special Session on Friday, May 10, 1957, at 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers for the purpose of hearing verbal protests and also to study written protests to any or all portions of the contemplated L.I.D. #25.

In the absence of Mayor John Rogers, Councilman Don Foote served as acting Mayor. Present, Councilmen Johnson, Petersen, and Freeman. Also present: Roy C. Barnes, City Clerk; Art Smith, City Attorney; Claude Black, City Engineer; A. H. Evans, City Draftsman; and Veral Bates, City Inspector.

The Chamber was well filled and various protests were heard. A complete and accurate transcript of the proceedings were taken by Mr. Les Poole, County Court Recorder, by means of a shorthand transcript and also a tape recorder. When finalized, this will be filed in its entirety in the City Clerk's office.

It was announced by Acting Mayor Foote that no final decisions would be made at this meeting, but that all protests, both written and verbal, would be properly and thoroughly studied by the Councilmen and the City Engineer.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Petersen, that the Council adjourn. Carried.
