

APRIL 19, 1957

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session, Friday, April 19, 1957, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: John B. Rogers, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Johnson, Petersen and Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, P.A.; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meetings held on April 6th, 8th, and 11th, were read and approved.

Rev. Donald Austin of the United Pentecostal Church, 260 Gladstone, appeared before the Council relative to the use of trailer house as a parsonage, trailer to be parked at the side of Church, will connect to water line and sewer, wants permission to go ahead. Referred to the Building Committee.

Mr. G. K. Hargrave, wants permission to have trailer house, in the 800 Block between I and J Streets, sets on Lot 4, Block 6, Edgewater Heights. No action taken.

Mr. Lloyd E. Fackler, 932 Poulson, Bel Aire, representing himself and neighbors, appeared before the Council, relative to sewer situation at Poulson and Alameda Streets, 13 houses in Block , 6 want to participate and 5 unable to participate in the sewer line; after considerable discussion, the matter was referred to the City Engineer and Sanitary Committee.

ORDINANCE NO. 881

AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING PORTIONS OF FIFTH STREET IN IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF CORPORATION OF THE PRESIDING BISHOP OF THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER DAY SAINTS, A UTAH CORPORATION SOLE, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS; AND FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF SQUIRE C. BARLOW; PARTICULARLY AND SEPARATELY DESCRIBING THE PORTIONS OF FIFTH STREET SO VACATED FOR THE USE OF EACH; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

The foregoing Ordinance was presented in title. It was moved by Councilman Johnson, seconded by Foote, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None; carried. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; No, None. The majority of all members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.
