

JANUARY 8, 1957

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Recessed Session, Tuesday, January 8, 1957, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: John B. Rogers, Mayor; Councilmen Petersen, Freeman, and Foote; Absent, Councilman Johnson. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, P.A.; Arthur Smith, City Attorney; and C.R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of the Meetings held on December 21<sup>st</sup>, 1956 and January 4<sup>th</sup>, 1957, were read and approved.

Chas. Wilson appeared before the Council with reference to the installing of one glass heat unit in residence on N. Water Avenue. It was the sense of the Council that a permit should be issued.

ORDINANCE NO. 873

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A CERTAIN DOCUMENT AS THE OFFICIAL BUILDING CODE OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; PARTICULARLY DESCRIBING SAID DOCUMENTS; PROVIDING FOR ITS CERTIFICATION BY THE CITY CLERK AND FOR THE FILING OF THREE COPIES THEREOF IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING THAT THE PROVISIONS CONTAINED IN SAID DOCUMENT SHALL REGULATE THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, ENLARGEMENT, ALTERATION, REPAIR, MOVING, REMOVAL, DEMOLITION, CONVERSION, OCCUPANCY, EQUIPMENT, USE, HEIGHT, AREA AND MAINTENANCE OF ALL BUILDINGS AND/OR

STRUCTURES IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING WHEN THE ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.
