I am appealing the decision of the Appeal Board who decided recently against my petition to have a small apartment placed in the basement of my new house on Boise Avenue.

I believe that my new home is a distinct improvement to that block in which I am building, and since there is no evidence outside of the house to indicate a duplicate family abode (two family unit), it appears that the fact of the basement apartment will not detract from the overall appearance of the District.

I need the income that I will have from the apartment, and will of course keep the property in excellent shape for the rental. I anticipate my renters from temple workers, since the home is near enough to the Temple to be attractive to renters.

I have already turned over to your Building Permit Office a list of signers of owners of the surrounding territory, and have not had any objection from those owners of any manner.

I had intended to build the apartment in my new home for income purposes, and for companionship. I am sorry that the issue was confused. I am asking that the permit be granted, and ask your most sincere consideration of the matter.
