

OCTOBER 7, 1955

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session, October 7, 1955, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Petersen, Freeman; Rogers absent. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; A. L. Smith, City Attorney; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meetings held on September 22nd and 30th, were read and approved.

Mr. J. T. Clark, representing the Pillsbury Mills, appeared before the Council relative to the closing of road south of the Airport and also requesting new road to be built around the Airport, etc. After considerable discussion, the matter of new road was taken under advisement.

ORDINANCE NO. 853

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO (EDGEMONT GARDENS ADDITION)

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Foote, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Foote, Petersen and Freeman; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Foote, Petersen and Freeman; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

The Mayor announced that this was the date set for the opening of the bids for repair diversion dam at City Power Plant, as per notice to bidders; the bids were opened and read as follows:

Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Foote, Petersen and Freeman; No, None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Petersen and seconded by Foote, that the plat of the Edgemont Gardens Addition, be accepted. Roll call resulted as follows: Yes, 3; No, None; Motion carried.

The following letter from the I. F. Armory Assn., was read:

Dear Mayor Fanning:

Request permission to install propane heating units in the Tautphaus Park Armory since no heat is presently available. Further request permission to remove the heating units if the building is vacated by the National Guard prior to January 1, 1966 in which event the building would be repaired to the same condition as it was prior to installation of heating unit, fair wear and tear excepted: that further the City of Idaho Falls will have option to buy the installed heating units if the building is vacated by the National Guard prior to last date above mentioned.

All work will be done in a workmanlike manner by qualified personnel.

Request permission to build a strong room 8'X10' inside measurements from cinder block and concrete for the storage of sensitive items and weapons.
