

JUNE 17, 1955

The City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session, June 17, 1955, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, Rogers, and Petersen. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Petersen, Purchasing Agent; A. L. Smith, City Attorney; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of the Meeting held on June 8th, 1955, were read and approved.

Mr. Benton presented a plat of the Squire Barlow Addition for approval, stating that Lots 10 to 16, to be re-platted later. After considerable discussion, no action was taken.

Duane Gardner and Merrill Smith, representing the J. C. of Commerce, requesting that the swimming pool park should be named Jaycees Park. It was the sense of the Council that this request be denied. It was agreed by the Council that a plaque would be installed at the base of the flag pole, at the swimming pool.

We, the undersigned property owners and taxpayers in the neighborhood of Baldwin's Super Market at 815 S. Holmes Avenue, Idaho Falls, Idaho, wish to place ourselves on record as strongly opposing the use of, building upon, or encumbrance of Lot 3, Blackburn Addition, adjacent directly to the south of Baldwin's Super Market, for any commercial purpose. The said Lot 3, Blackburn Addition, is presently zoned "R-1 Residential" and owned by the power of Baldwin's Super Market, who has verbally declared his intention of "black-topping" or paving Lot 3, Blackburn Addition for the purpose of facilitating parking space for his adjacent commercial property.

We oppose his proposal not only as a commercial encroachment on our primarily residential neighborhood, but also as needless to the proper planning of our City, which has already provided zoning for adequate shopping areas in this part of the City without having such areas haphazardly spread throughout the nicer neighborhood.
