ORDINANCE NO. 848

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATIONS OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1955-1956, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS.

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Foote, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes,

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Councilmen Petersen, Freeman, Foote and Rogers; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" The following letter for D. V. Groberg, was read:

June 1, 1955

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council
City of Idaho Falls

Gentlemen:

When the first Addition of Linden Park was platted in 1949, several small irregularly shaped parcels of land, between the lots and streets, were dedicated to the City as parks, in Block 3, 4, and 5.

The City has not been maintaining these parks, and it has been up to the adjacent property owners to maintain these small strips of land. Since these property owners have to keep these strips of land up without being assured that an investment in shrubs, etc., will not be taken over by the City, they have not been properly maintained by City or adjacent property owners.

WE HEREBY REQUEST that these above described parcels of land be vacated to the adjacent lot owners.

We have discussed this matter with your City Engineer, Mr. Black, and he says the above parcels of land are of no use to the City. He said he would recommend this vacation, as a large portion of street improvements adjacent to these parcels would be against the City and they would derive no benefit as they are too small for any use.

RESOLUTION (Resolution No. 1955-14)

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 29, Title 50, Idaho Code, and by deed of the City Treasurer dated the 13th day of December, 1954, recorded in book 94, of deeds at Page 265, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to and possession of the following described real property, to-wit:

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Lots Seventeen (17), Eighteen (18), Nineteen (19) and Twenty (20), Block Fifty-six (56), of Highland Park Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, as per recorded plat thereof.

WHEREAS, Virlow C. Petersen, has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls the amount for which said property was sold to the City, together with all the installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold to the City, together with all the installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and the hereby are, authorized and directed, upon the payment of said sum of money by said purchaser, to make, execute, and deliver to the said Virlow C. Petersen a deed to said property, pursuant to the provisions of Section 50-2951, Idaho Code.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Councilman Foote, that the Mayor and Council extend to Councilman Freeman a vote of thanks for effective service that he has rendered to the City, during the eight years that he acted as president of the Council, and also, the Council write a letter of appreciation, to be signed by all Councilmen and place the letter in the minutes. Roll call resulted as follows: Yes, Councilmen Foote, Rogers and Petersen; No, None; Carried.
