The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Recessed Session July 8th, 1954, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Petersen, Freeman, Foote and Rogers. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 29, Title 50, Idaho Code, and by deed of the City Treasurer dated the 15th day of January, 1954, recorded in Book 90 of deeds at Page 31, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to and possession of the following described real property, to-wit:
