

FEBRUARY 5, 1954

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session on February 5, 1954, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, and Petersen. Absent: Councilman Rogers. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meeting held on January 19th were read and approved.

The following proposal from CORNELL, ROWLAND, HAYES & MERRYFIELD was read.

1. Establish a long range plan for the development of swimming pool facilities which will ultimately be required to adequately serve the anticipated future requirements of the City. Development of this plan will include determination of the ultimate capacity of swimming pools which will be required to serve expected loads, and studies of the most suitable sizes and locations of the required facilities.
2. Determine the most suitable location for the initial development of swimming pool facilities on the basis of the long range plan developed under Item 1.
3. Supervise and assist City personnel in subsurface explorations necessary to determine foundation conditions at the site selected for initial development.
4. Prepare preliminary plans for at least three alternate layouts for construction of facilities which will fulfill the requirements of the site selected for initial development.

5. Prepare preliminary estimates of construction costs and annual costs of operation for each of the preliminary plans developed under Item 4.
6. Present the results of this investigation in a bound report, including preliminary plans, cost estimates, supporting data, and recommendations and discuss this report in person with the City Council.

We would be pleased to accomplish the work outlined on a per diem basis at a total cost to the City of Idaho Falls not to exceed \$450.00.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Foote, that the above proposal be accepted. Roll call resulted as follows: Yes, Freeman, Foote, Petersen; No, None; Absent, Rogers; Carried.
