AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Rogers, seconded by Freeman, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Freeman, Foote, Rogers and Petersen; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Freeman, Foote, Rogers and Petersen; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

The City Attorney reported to the Council that he had investigated the following claims:

He then recommended to the Council that all three claims and the whole thereof be denied, on the grounds and for the reasons that the injuries complained of, if any were caused by Ray Coleman, in his construction of a sanitary sewer in Local Improvement District #23 in Idaho Falls; and that in the premises Ray Coleman was an independent contractor and that the City of Idaho Falls was not negligent, nor at fault, nor in any manner liable for any of the said injuries and damages.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that the above recommendations be accepted and that the said claims be denied. Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Petersen, Freeman, Foote and Rogers; Nay, None; Motion carried.
