

JUNE 8, 1953

Presented are minutes of a Recessed Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held June 8th, 1953. There were present at said Meeting: Mayor E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Petersen, Freeman, Foote. Also present: Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney; Claude Black, City Engineer; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent. Minutes of Regular Meeting of May 6th and Special Meeting of May 27th, and June 5th were read. Their being no corrections to said minutes the same were unanimously approved as read.

The bills against the City for the month of May, 1953, having been audited by the Finance Committee, were presented for payment as follows, to-wit:

It was moved by Councilman Freeman, seconded by Petersen, that the bills be allowed and the Clerk is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of the same. Roll call voting Aye, Petersen, Freeman, Foote, Rogers; Nay, None; Carried.

The reports of the various Departments were read and there being no objection, they were ordered placed on file.

The Southeastern Securities Company of Pocatello requested the City to place on sale the following descried property:

The matter was referred to the City Engineer and Street Committee.

Also application for Soft Drink license signed by Leland Harker, for Village Coffee Shop, 235 Cliff Street was read. It was moved by Foote, seconded by Petersen, that the licenses be granted and that the proper cards and licenses be issued by the City Clerk. Roll call voting Aye, Foote, Rogers, Petersen and Freeman; Nay, None; Carried.

The following communication was read:

“Honorable Mayor and City Council
Request to lease one lot at Idaho Falls Airport.

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I hereby make application to lease one lot near the south end of the Idaho Falls Airport. Said lot is fifty feet wide and one hundred feet long and lies just north of Dr. Warner's hangar, which is a cinder block hangar. The south most boundary of the lot lies approximately five feet north of Dr. Warner's hangar and the west most boundary lies seventy-five feet approximately east of the taxi strip and parallel to the taxi strip.

ORDINANCE NO. 825

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1953-1954, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS.

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Petersen, seconded by Rogers, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Freeman, Foote, Rogers, and Petersen; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Freeman, Foote, Rogers, and Petersen; No, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

The following letter was read by the City Clerk:

It was moved by Petersen seconded by Rogers, that the request be denied partly on the grounds that the proceedings were irregular to withdraw lands from the City, once it had been annexed, and that the City Clerk notify him to that effect. Roll call voting Aye, Foote, Rogers, Petersen, and Freeman; voting Nay, None; Carried.

An ordinance "ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS: DESCRIBING SAID LANDS AND DECLARING SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO" was presented by the Planning Board with the recommendation that the lands described in said Ordinance be taken into the City. Action was postponed pending further study.

There being no further business to come before the Meeting, it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Rogers, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, Freeman, Foote, Rogers, and Petersen; Nay, None; Carried.
