January 19, 1953

Gentlemen;

"We request that permission be granted to us to have the dead-end street located between our building and Mr. L. Malmberg's Blue Bell Station, closed or blocked off.

Our reason for this request is that since the completion of the North Highway, this alley-way has been used to such an extent that a large hole has been made. This hole has since become filled with water. As a result a truck or car using this alley is causing the foundation of our building to be slowly undercut from the wash of the water.

Also, in summer use it is creating a dust which causes a hardship on Mr. Malmberg's place of business as well as ours.

We sincerely hope that this be granted."
