Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in a Special Session on March 13, 1953, at 1:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the purpose of considering bus franchise. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson and Foote; Absent, Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk and Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

ORDINANCE NO. 814

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING IDAHO FALLS MOTOR COACH COMPANY, A CORPORATION ORGANIZED AND EXISTING UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AN EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO USE THE STREETS AND AVENUES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPERATING PASSENGER BUSES; REQUIRING AND FILING OF ROUTE SCHEDULES WITH THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING THE MAXIMUM FARE TO BE CHARGED; PROVIDING FOR THE CLASS OF SERVICE TO BE GIVEN; PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF SUITABLE PARKING PLACES; PROVIDING PAYMENT OF A PERCENTAGE OF THE GROSS INCOME TO CITY, AND FOR GENERAL REGULATIONS OF SAID BUSES BY THE CITY COUNCIL; PROVIDING FOR FORFEITURE OF THE FRANCHISE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Rogers, seconded by Foote, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Johnson, Rogers, Foote; No, None; Absent, Freeman. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, Rogers, Foote, Johnson; No, None; Absent, Freeman. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that the Council adjourn. On roll call voting Yes, 3; No, None; Absent, Freeman; Carried.
