

FEBRUARY 20, 1953

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session on February 20, 1953, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Johnson, Freeman, Foote, & Rogers. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. T. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney; C. R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meetings held on February 6th and 16th, were read and approved.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers, that the old bills of Mrs. Walter Lumby, be cancelled and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to issue proper credits. Bills at 1139 Kearney and 461 19th - Amounts, \$41.40 and \$204.95, respectfully. On roll call voting Yes, 4; No, None; Carried.

RESOLUTION

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RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls is contemplating the construction of a concrete subway to carry a public highway across the right-of-way and under the track of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company, a corporation of the State of Utah, and the Union Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation of the State of Utah, at Seventeenth Street in said City, which will require the construction of a temporary eight-span pile and frame trestle and shoofly track, removing present track and restoring it over said concrete structure when construction of same is completed;

WHEREAS, a written memorandum of agreement has been submitted to the City, which agreement is between the said Oregon Short Line Railroad Company and the said Union Pacific Railroad Company, designated parties of the first part, and the City of Idaho Falls, a municipal corporation, designated party of the second part, and which agreement consists of seven (7) typewritten pages and fifteen (15) numbered sections, and sets forth the terms and conditions under which said subway and said temporary structures shall be constructed.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO:

That the Mayor be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute said agreement on behalf of said City, that the Clerk be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to execute and seal said agreement on behalf of said City.
