

DECEMBER 30, 1952

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in a Special Session on December 30, 1952, at 2 P.M. for the purpose of considering new ordinance regulating slot machines; also, resolution accepting quit claim deed from Joseph A. Skinner, etal, as a gift, to be used for public streets and ways. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, Rogers and Johnson. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

The following Ordinance was presented to the Council, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 809

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES AS DEFINED BY TITLE 50, CHAPTER 15, IDAHO CODE; PROVIDING LIMITATIONS ON LICENSES; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF LICENSE FEES FOR THE OPERATION OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES; PROVIDING REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF SAID DEVICES AND LICENSING THE SAME; PROVIDING THE FORM OF LICENSE OR STAMP TO BE OBTAINED AND DISPLAYED THEREFORE AND THE CANCELLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE PRORATING OF LICENSE FEES FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE REVOCATION OF LICENSES AND FOR THE NOTICE OF HEARING PRECEDING SUCH REVOCATIONS; PROVIDING FOR A SAVING CLAUSE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The above Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Foote and seconded by Rogers, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, heretofore on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of December, 1952, the following owners, namely, Joseph A. Skinner, Jr., and Anna Skinner, husband and wife, Newell Graham and Mae Graham, husband and wife, F. J. Edwards and Carol E. Edwards, husband and wife, conveyed by Quit Claim Deed, for street purposes, to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, the following described lands in Bonneville County, Idaho, and described more particularly as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point that is S. 71° 12' E. 647.7 feet from the West ¼ corner of Section 18 T. 2N., R. 38 EBM and S. 87° 17' E. 57.0 feet, said point being the true point of beginning and said point being also on the South line of K Street extended and running thence S. 61° 11' E. along the South line of K Street extended 226 feet more or less to the East Bank of Willow Creek which point is also on the Westerly boundary of the Elg Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; thence Northwesterly along the meanderings of said East bank and boundary of the Elg Addition to the intersection of this line with the North line of K Street extended; thence N. 61° 11' W. 29.78 feet more or less to the East Boundary of the Edgewater Heights Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; thence S. 14° 09' E. 66.74 feet; thence N. 87° 17' W. 33.0 feet to the point of beginning.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL of the City of Idaho Falls that title to the above described premises be accepted by said City as a gift for use as public streets and ways.
