The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session on December 19, 1952, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. Present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; C. R. Black, City Engineer; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of Meetings held on December 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, were read and approved.

ORDINANCE NO. 808

ANA ORDINANCE EMPOWERING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO TO CAUSE TEMPORARY SIGNS TO BE ERECTED AND POSTED DESIGNATING STREETS AND PARTS THEREOF WITHIN SAID CITY WHEREON MOTOR VEHICLES SHALL NOT BE PARKED DURING DESIGNATED TIMES; PROVIDING FOR THE FORM AND SUFFICIENCY OF SAID SIGNS AND THE MANNER OF POSTING; PROHIBITING PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN VIOLATION OF THE DIRECTIONS UPON SAID SIGNS; AUTHORIZING THE REMOVAL OF VEHICLES PARKED IN VIOLATION OF SAID SIGNS; IMPOSING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The above Ordinance was read by the City Clerk:

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman, that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with.

The question being, "SHALL THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-2004 OF THE IDAHO CODE REQUIRING ALL ORDINANCES TO BE READ ON THREE SEVERAL DAYS BE DISPENSED WITH?"

Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Foote; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "SHALL THE ORDINANCE PASS?"

Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Foote; Nay, None.

The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1950, one Thomas E. Birch, a widower, executed and delivered to Fielding Memorial Park, Inc., an Idaho Corporation, to secure the payment of his promissory note of even date therewith, a mortgage on the following land lying and being in Bingham County, Idaho:

Commencing at a point 33 feet west and 204 feet south of the northeast corner of Lot No. 1 north, Range 37 east of the Boise Meridian in Idaho and running thence north 300 feet; thence in a northwesterly direction 173 feet more or less to the intersection with the east bank of the Cedar Point Canal; thence southwesterly along the east bank of said canal to a point directly west of the point of beginning; thence east 485 feet, more or less to the point of beginning. Together with all ditch and water rights thereunto appertaining.

WHEREAS, said note and mortgage for valuable consideration were duly assigned by the Fielding Memorial Park Inc., to the City of Idaho Falls, on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May, 1952, and

WHEREAS, said note and mortgage have been fully paid.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that the Mayor and City Clerk of the said City be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver on behalf of said City to the said Thomas E. Birch, a full release and satisfaction of said mortgage.

Robert D. Pollock, Detective of the Police Department; Edward Brown, Arthur R. Chandler, Les Corcoran, and Ray R. Lindsay, as Probationary Firemen, effective January 1, 1953. Morgan Parks, Lieutenant Fire Department.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman, that the above appointments be sustained. On roll call voting Yes, 4; No, None; Carried.

Mayor Fanning appointed Mr. Aden Hyde to fill the unexpired term of E. A. Owen, as a member of the Library Board, term expiring in April, 1953.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson, that the above appointment be sustained. On roll call voting Yes, 4; No, None; Carried.

WHEREAS, EMORY A. OWEN, lately of the City of Idaho Falls, served as a member of the Idaho Falls Public Library Board from his appointment in May, 1933, until his death, November 29, 1952. He also served as Chairman of said Board the past eight years and served as City Attorney during the years 1949-1951; and
