

SEPTEMBER 11, 1952

Pursuant to a call by the Acting Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Special Session on September 11, 1952, at 8 P.M. for the purpose of approving Resolution calling for special election to be held on Tuesday, October 14, 1952, to vote on the question, SHALL THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO ADOPT THE CITY MANAGER PLAN OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT, AS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 79, IDAHO SESSION LAWS, 1917?; also to approve the appointment of Registrars. Present: R. A. Freeman, Acting Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Johnson and Foote; Absent, E. W. Fanning, Mayor and John B. Rogers, Councilman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk and Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

R. A. Freeman presided as Acting Mayor and the following Resolution was presented, to-wit:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of July, 1952, a petition of electors, equal in number to 25% of the votes cast for all candidates for Mayor, at the last preceding general City election was filed with the Clerk, praying that an election be held in the City of Idaho Falls to determine whether said City should adopt the City Manager Plan of Municipal Government; and

WHEREAS, on the 27th day of July, 1952, the Mayor of said City proclaimed an election to be held October 14, 1952, to submit that question to the voters of said City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO:

Section 1. That a special election is hereby called to be held in the City of Idaho Falls on the 14th day of October, 1952, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said City the proposition set forth in the form of ballot appearing in Section 4 hereof.

Section 2. That the polls at said election shall be open at the hour of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and remain open continuously until the hour of 7:00 o'clock P.M., and then close. Said election shall be held at the voting places set forth in Section 4 hereof.

Section 3. That all persons who at the time of election are qualified electors of the City, properly registered, and possessing the qualifications of residents, shall be qualified to vote at said election and the ballots to be used at said election shall be substantially in the form set forth in Section 4 hereof.

Section 4. That the notice of said election shall be given by the City Clerk by publication of the following notice in at least two issues in the Post Register, a daily (except Saturday) newspaper printed and published in the City of Idaho Falls, the first of which publication shall be made not less than twenty (20) days previous to the date of said election; and the City Clerk shall give further notice of said election by posting said notice at each voting place to be used at said election and at two (2)

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other public places in each precinct, in said City for not less than twenty (20) days previous to said election.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Pursuant to the laws of the State of Idaho and Resolution duly adopted by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, County of Bonneville, State of Idaho, notice is hereby given that a Special Election shall be held in said City at the voting places hereinafter designated, on Tuesday, the 14th day of October, 1952, beginning at the hour of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and closing at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P.M. of said day for the purpose of taking a vote upon the following question, to-wit:

“Shall the City of Idaho Falls adopt the City Manager Plan of Municipal Government, as set forth in Chapter 79, Idaho Session Laws, 1917?

The designated voting places of said election are as follows, to-wit:

Precinct No. 1, First Ward, Log Hut, Highland Park

Precinct No. 2, First Ward, Riverside School

Precinct No. 1, Second Ward, City Hall

Precinct No. 1, Third Ward, East Side School

Precinct No. 2, Third Ward, Junior High School

Precinct No. 3, Third Ward, Hawthorne School

Precinct No. 1, Fourth Ward, State Garage

Precinct No. 2, Fourth Ward, Emerson School

Notice is further given that only qualified electors of said City and who are registered as provided by law are entitled to vote at said election. No qualified elector who is duly registered as a voter in the last preceding general municipal election shall be required to register so long as he remains, or has remained, continuously after such registration, a duly qualified elector of the City of Idaho Falls; provided, after any qualified elector has registered, he has failed to keep his continuous residence and full qualifications to vote in said City, regardless of how short the term of his disqualification shall exist or have existed, he shall not be entitled to vote at such election after such disqualification existed, unless he shall have re-registered for the election at which he next desires to vote. If such elector shall have removed to another precinct within the City, he or she shall notify the City Clerk of such change of address and such Clerk shall register him or her in the precinct to which the elector shall have removed.

S. R. Rostad, City Clerk, is the ex-officio registrar of said City. The place of registration is the office of said City Clerk at the City Building.

Persons may register on each day at anytime during the office hours of said Clerk, beginning with the day that the Notice of Election is given and continuing until and including the Saturday next preceding the election; and on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday next

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preceding the election, persons may register between the hours of 9:00 o'clock A.M. and 5:00 P.M. and between the hours of 7:00 o'clock P.M. and 9:00 o'clock P.M.

The voting at said election shall be by ballot. The ballot to be supplied the voters for their use at said election shall be substantially in the following form:
