

AUGUST 7, 1952

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session on August 7, 1952, at 8 P. M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Johnson, Freeman, Foote, and Rogers. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney and Claude R. Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meetings held on July 18th, 28th, and 30th, were read and approved.

The bills against the City for the month of July 1952, having been audited by the Finance Committee were presented for payment as follows:

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers, that the bills be allowed and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the proper funds, in payment of the same. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson, that the Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to order and purchase the following materials, to-wit:

Petersen, Elks Club, J. A. McAtee, Samoa and Shepard K. Lenscott, Bon Villa Club. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson, that the above applications be granted and the City Clerk is instructed to issue the proper cards and license. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

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It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson, that the applications for one substitute license for Slot Machine, by J. A. McAtee, Samoa Club, be granted. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

The following applications for Coin-operated Amusement Device was presented: Floyd Mead, 1st Street Snacks, 216 1st Street, one machine-\$208.34. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that the above application be granted and license issued for the balance of 1952, subject to the approval of the Chief of Police. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

The monthly reports of the various departments were presented by the City Clerk. There being no objections, the reports were accepted and ordered placed on file.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman, that the application for Photographer License by Don's Studio, Boise, Idaho, be rejected and the check signed by Jesse Owings for \$5.00 be returned. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

A petition signed by 10 property owners on Ada Street who are in favor of no parking between sidewalk and curb; also a petition signed by Charles W. Bateman, Donald F. Latimer and Paul B. Hammond, favoring the elimination of parking strip on Shelley Street between Ada and Bannock, was read by the City Clerk. The above petitions were referred to the City Engineer for investigation.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson, that the bid for painting the outside walls, by Wilson and Swenson, Shelley, Idaho, Armory Building, labor and materials \$1200.00, Salvation Army Bldg. & Annex, labor and materials \$700.00, total, \$1,900.00, be accepted. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that all bids for the construction of sub fire station in hereby rejected. On roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None; carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is needed for the best interests of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that a well and pump be drilled and installed on the west side of Snake River in said City to supplement the water supply of said City.

WHEREAS, it is deemed equitable that all persons desiring to develop land for residential purposes in the area to be served by said well should reimburse the City in part for the cost of said well and installation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

That the Mayor and City Clerk of said City be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute on behalf of said City a contract with Johns Investment Company, an Idaho Corporation, Merritt Johns and Margaret C. Johns, husband and wife and Harry J. Holmgren and Louise Holmgren, which said contract shall embody the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

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A twenty-two (22) inch well shall be drilled and a pump installed therein and a twelve (12) inch water main and four (4) connections shall be installed from said well to the north end of Saturn Avenue, in said City; and the said pump shall deliver a flow of water into said main of not less than 350 gallons per minute all prior to April 1, 1953. At all times thereafter a water pressure shall be maintained in said main of not less than forty (40) pounds per square inch.

The above named persons contracting with the City shall, upon completion of the well, aforesaid, pay to the City the following sums of money:

The said Merritt Johns and Margaret C. Johns shall deed to the City, by good and sufficient Warranty Deed, free of liens and encumbrances, all land necessary to accommodate said well, pump and attachments. The City shall pay the said Merritt Johns and Margaret C. Johns the sum of \$1500.00 for said lands if the well shall not be drilled and the pump installed as aforesaid. The persons above named shall each receive in return for the payment of the sum of money, aforesaid, to the City, the right of access to City water upon lands within or without said City designated by them of the acreage appearing opposite their names as follows:

Johns Investment Company,	16 acres;	William R. & Beulah Hatch,	33 acres;
Louis B. Craig & wife,	14 acres;	O. H. & Maurine Hansen,	5 acres;
Merritt & Margaret Johns,	17 acres;	Harry J. & Louise Holmgren,	5 acres.

The City shall retain the right to regulate the use of said water as is customary in said City and to charge the usual rate for the use of the same, including all connection charges. The above named persons shall install all necessary water conduits, except said twelve (12) inch main and its connections, at their own proper costs and expense, and title to all said conduits shall vest in the City forthwith upon completion of their installation .
