

MAY 23, 1952

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Recessed Session on May 23, 1952, in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Rogers and Johnson. Absent: Councilman Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk, T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent, Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney, and Claude Black, City Engineer.

The minutes of Meetings held on May 8th and 12th, were read and approved.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson, that the City accept the bid of \$1,000.00 by Albert Miller, for residence at 148 N. Placer Avenue; the highest bidder failed to qualify. On roll call, voting Aye, 3. Nay, None. Absent, One. Motion Carried.

LICENSE TO USE SWIMMING POOL

THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into in duplicate this 20th day of May, 1952, by and between BONNEVILLE CLASS A SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 91, of Bonneville County, Idaho, hereinafter designated first party, and the CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, a municipal corporation of Bonneville County, Idaho, hereinafter designated a second party, WITNESSETH:

That in and for consideration of the performance by second party of the covenants herein set forth by second party to be performed, first party hereby grants to second party the exclusive privilege of occupying and using for the benefit of the public, or any portion thereof, to be determined by second party, that certain swimming pool situate in the old high school in the City of Idaho Falls, together with all rooms, machinery, facilities, and all other property necessary to the complete enjoyment of said swimming pool and heretofore usually occupied for said purpose.

This license shall commence June 1, 1952, and terminate August 31, 1952, unless regular school commence prior to August 31, 1952, in which case this license shall terminate August 16, 1952.

The pool shall be operated under the direction of a manager to be selected by the Director of Municipal Summer Recreation of second party. All subordinate employees, gratuitous and otherwise including cashiers, ticket takers, valuables checkers, life guards, and janitors shall be selected by the Director of Municipal Summer Recreation in cooperation with

the trustees of first party; provided, however, second party shall have the right to reject any and all of said appointees. The firemen shall be chosen by the party of the first part.

Second party may charge and keep for its own use and benefit such admission fees and rentals as second party shall determine.

All scheduling and use of the pool by special groups shall be approved by the Mayor or City Council of second party.

Second party agrees to indemnify and hold harmless first party from all cost, losses and damages which first party may sustain by reason of occupancy of the said premises by second party.

Second party shall pay all salaries and costs of fuel, lights, water and water purification in the operation of said pool.

First party shall keep the said premises insured against loss by fire during the terms of this license; but first party shall have no responsibility hereunder by reason of any losses to any member of the public or personal property by theft or fire.

Second party shall return possession of said premises to first party at the termination of this agreement in substantially the same condition as when first occupied by second party, normal wear and tear excepted.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused these papers to be executed by their lawful officers hereunto duly authorized.
