The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session on May 2, 1952, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Rogers, Johnson. Absent, Councilman Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, Attorney; Claude L. Black, Engineer; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent.

The minutes of Meetings held on April 18, and 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1952, were read and approved.

A letter dated May 1, from Leon and Minnie Poorman asking permission for the removal of 24 feet of curbing from the present Curtis Avenue entrance at 1798 Curtis, Sue-Preme Drive-Inn, was read by the City Clerk. The letter was referred to the Street and Ditch Committee.

A letter dated May 1, 1952, from 14 property owners residing on Cassia Avenue requesting the paving of Cassia Avenue from sidewalk to sidewalk, omitting parking strip, was read by the City Clerk. The letter was referred to the City Engineer.

The Mayor announced that the terms of Mrs. J. J. Smith and Lynn Crandall, as members of the Idaho Falls Library Board will expire soon and reappointed Mrs. J. J. Smith and Lynn Crandall as members of the Library Board. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Foote, that the above appointments be approved. On roll call, voting Aye, Councilmen Johnson, Foote and Rogers. Absent, Freeman. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Foote, that the bid by Dell-Bell Motor, Inc. to furnish one 1952 Plymouth Cambridge 4 door sedan, for a cash difference of \$758.50, be accepted. Selling price \$2124.50, less tax, \$136.00, less 1951 used Chevrolet, \$1230.00, net \$758.50. On roll call, voting Aye, Councilmen Rogers, Johnson, and Foote. Absent, Freeman. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to sell residence on South Placer Avenue to the best advantage. On roll call, voting Aye, Councilmen Foote, Rogers and Johnson. Absent, Freeman. Nay, None. Carried.

The Mayor announced that this being the time to hear and consider any protests (written) against the proposed improvements for the creation of Local Improvement District No. 23 for sewer for the City of Idaho Falls, several written protests were received and discussed. The protests were then referred to the City Engineer for study and consideration.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that the City allow one months rent to E. G. McCarty, as allowance for painting and repairing hangar at Airport for \$250.00. On roll call, voting Aye, Councilmen Foote, Rogers and Johnson. Absent, Freeman. Motion carried.

No further business appearing, the Mayor declared the Meeting recessed to 8 P.M., May 8, 1952.
