

MARCH 10, 1952

Pursuant to a call by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Special Session on March 10, 1952, at 3:30 P.M. for the purpose of reconsidering bids on Airport Lighting. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Russell A. Freeman, Vernon S. Johnson, John B. Rogers and Donald R. Foote. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; Arthur Smith, City Attorney and Claude Black, City Engineer.

RESOLUTION

Resolved, that the proposal bid of Gem State Electric Co., for Airport lighting construction at Idaho Falls, Idaho, F. A. A. P. Project No. 9-10-060 lighting, be rejected for the following reasons, to-wit:

1. Said bid is unbalanced on its face.
2. No bid proposal was submitted with the bid at the time of opening bids, and that the bid of Thompson Electric Service, Salt Lake City, Utah, submitted for the above construction be accepted, subject however, to the approval of the C. A. A. and subject to the compliance by said bidder with all requirements under the laws of State of Idaho.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the above resolution be passed. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Meeting, it was duly adjourned.
