

FEBRUARY 7, 1952

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Recessed Session February 7, 1952, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers of Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of the Meeting held on January 18th, were read and approved.

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RESOLUTION

January 8, 1952

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls has sold certain properties in accordance with the due process of law;

Said property is legally described below and will be further identified in this resolution as Parcel A.

AND WHEREAS the property now commonly known as the residence of Mr. W. G. Ovard, 425 S. Holmes, Idaho Falls, Idaho, (fully described below and to be referred to as Parcel B in this resolution) lies adjacent to Parcel A;

AND WHEREAS, the properties herein referred to as Parcel A and Parcel B remain unclassified as to zoning regulations;

AND WHEREAS, the owner or owners of said properties is desirous of knowing the intended zoning classification when the City deems it necessary to classify said property;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The intent of the Mayor and Council is to classify Parcels A and B as R-3 at the appropriate time.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Building Inspector is hereby authorized to issue building permits for the above described property in conformity with R-3 zoning.

PARCEL A: Beginning at a point that is S⁰ 51' E, 264 feet and S 0⁰ 18' W, 20.12 feet from the Northwest corner of the S¹/₂ SW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, Swc. 20, Twp 2 N., R. 38 E. B. M. and running thence S 0⁰ 18' W, 123.58 feet; thence S 89⁰ 51' E 120 feet; thence N 0⁰ 18' E 122.40 feet; thence N 89⁰ 17' 10" W, 120 feet to the Point of Beginning and containing 0.338 acres, more or less.

PARCEL B: Beginning at the SE corner of the intersection of 4th Street and Holmes Avenue; thence in an Easterly direction for a distance of 229.62'; thence in a Southerly direction 123.58'; thence Westerly 229.06'; thence Northerly 125.84' to the point of beginning.

ORDINANCE NO. 787

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING RESTAURANT, ITINERANT RESTAURANT, EMPLOYEE, UTENSILS, HEALTH OFFICER AND PERSON; REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE OPERATION OF SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS; PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ADULTERATED, UNWHOLESOME OR MISBRANDED FOOD OR DRINK; REGULATING THE INSPECTION, GRADING, RE-GRADING, AND PLACARDING OF SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS; THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES.

The above Ordinance was read by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman that the above Ordinance be adopted and passed on its third and final reading. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. All members voting in the affirmative the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted and passed.

ORDINANCE NO. 788

AN ORDINANCE MAKING UNLAWFUL THE CONDUCT OR OPERATION OF ANY PHOTO SHOP OR BUSINESS OF PHOTOGRAPHY WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, OR FOR PROFIT OR GAIN, TO TAKE, DEVELOP, PROCESS FINISH, OR RE-TOUCH AND PHOTOGRAPH WITHIN SAID CITY WITHOUT HAVING FIRST OBTAINED A PHOTOGRAPHER'S LICENSE THEREFORE; PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF SUCH ACTIVITIES; PROVIDING FOR THE FORM OF THE LICENSE, THE APPLICATION THEREFORE, THE PROCEDURE FOR GRANTING SUCH LICENSE, AND THE FEES TO BE PAID FOR OBTAINING THE SAME; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE.

The above Ordinance was read by the Clerk.

H. G. Clyburn, Boise, Idaho, representing the Merlite Industries Inc.. of New York, N.Y. appeared before the Council, explaining in detail the merits of small portable fire extinguisher, after some discussion the Mayor referred it to the Fire Department and the Fire and Police Committees.

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It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the golf course fees are to remain the same as last year's fees, viz; \$30.00 for annual single ticket, \$45.00 for annual ticket for man & wife, or \$7.50 monthly. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Foote that the offer from the Pocatello, Hide, Wool, & Fur Co., of \$500.00, for old auto bodies and frames from the City dump grounds be accepted. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.
