The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session January 18, 1952, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers of Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. ORDINANCE NO. 787

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING RESTAURANT, ITINERANT RESTAURANT, EMPLOYEE, UTENSILS, HEALTH OFFICER AND PERSON; REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE OPERATION OF SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS; PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ADULTERATED, UNWHOLESOME OR MISBRANDED FOOD OR DRINK; REGULATING THE INSPECTION, GRADING, RE-GRADING, AND PLACARDING OF SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS; THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES.

The above Ordinance was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Foote that the Ordinance be adopted, and passed on its second reading. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

RESOLUTION

Be it resolved by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; that Solaria Tract, an addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, shall be zoned by Ordinance duly enacted in the following manner and in accordance with the following plan, to-wit:

Section 1. Zoning Ordinance No. 641, City of Idaho Falls shall apply to Solaria Tract in accordance with classification as established by Section 2 of this Ordinance except that where time limitations refer to date of enactment said date shall mean the date of this Ordinance when applied to matters pertaining to Solaria Tract.

Section 2. Lot 1, Block 2, shall be zoned R-2; all of Block 1 of Lots 2 through 4 and Lot 8 Block 2 shall be zoned "C"; all of Block 6 and Lots 22 through 25 of Block 4 shall be zoned C-2; the remainder of Solaria Tract shall be zoned RP.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 18th day of January, 1952.

PETITION

We, the undersigned photographers of Idaho Falls, Idaho, request the Mayor and City Council to enact an ordinance forbidding photographers the right to do business within the City without first applying for a license, the fee for said license to be set by the Mayor and Council. The firm applying for license must apply in person.

It is further requested that the ordinance contain provisions requiring that non-resident photographers applications may be considered or taken under advisement for thirty days by the Council, if the Council deems the same advisable before either approving or disapproving the license. It was moved by Councilman Foote and seconded by Johnson that the City Clerk is hereby instructed to send out bids on new fire truck, as per specifications bids to be opened at 2 P.M. February 11, 1952. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the contract with the American Paper & Supply Co., be approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign the contract. Contract for chairs and equipment, amount \$37,231.11. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the contract with the Intermountain Theatre Supply Co., for stage draperies and riggings, and aisle carpeting and Lekolites be approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign the contract. The amount of the contract is \$11,625.00. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

The Mayor appointed the following to serve as members of the Planning Board, to-wit: B. L. Harris, K. P. Slusser, Gordon Boyle and Robert Schmidt (Asst. Mgr. Phillips Petroleum). It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the above appointments be approved. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

Mr. Robinson representing the As-O-Meter Corporation, Fendale, Mich., presented to the Council a proposition regarding advertising to be attached to parking meters. The City is to receive a fee of .60 per meter per month. After some discussion, it was referred to the Street Committee to report back at the next Council Meeting February 7th.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Council adjourn. Motion carried.
