

DECEMBER 21, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session December 21, 1951, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers of Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Also present: S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of Meetings held on December 11 and December 7, were read and approved.

The following applications for SOFT DRINKS and MEAT MARKET licenses were presented by the Clerk, to-wit: licenses numbered 140 to 164, Inc., 166 to 240, Inc., 254 to 268, Inc., and 270 to 301, Inc., totaled 147 licenses. A total of 102 licenses were for soft drinks and 42 for meat market. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Freeman that the above licenses be granted and the Clerk is instructed to issue the proper licenses. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. ORDINANCE NO. 784

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF THE OPERATION OF ICE CREAM STANDS, POP CORN STANDS, LUNCH STANDS, AND SOFT DRINK STANDS WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; ESTABLISHING THE LICENSE FEE FOR AND THE TERM OF SAID LICENSE; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The above Ordinance was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all Ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all Ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the Ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the Ordinance pass?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the contract with the First Street Plumbing & Heating Co., Idaho Falls, Idaho aggregating \$13,410.20 for the completion of plumbing & heating work on the Civic Auditorium be accepted and approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the above contract. On roll call voting Aye, Councilmen Johnson, Freeman, Foote and Rogers. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman that the contract with the Idaho Falls Electric Co., Idaho Falls, Idaho, aggregating \$10,129.00 for the completion of the electric wiring work on the Civic Auditorium be accepted and approved and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the above contract. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Foote that the contract with the Idaho Waterworks Corporation, aggregating \$21,568.74 for chlorination, metering, and accessory equipment for the 5 wells be accepted and approved, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the above contract. On roll call voting Aye, Foote, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Nay, None. Carried.

The Mayor instructed the Police Committee to see the photographers regarding proposed Ordinance on itinerant photographers.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the Council adjourn. Carried.
