

OCTOBER 19, 1951

AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING PORTER AVENUE IN SOUTH BEL-AIRE ADDITION TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF BEL-AIRE BUILDING COMPANY, INC., A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS; AND PARTICULARLY DESCRIBING SAID PORTER AVENUE.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF ALL NON-METALLIC SHEATHED CABLE IN THE WIRING OF BUILDINGS FOR THE USE OF ELECTRICITY THEREIN WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The above Ordinance was read by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Freeman that the above Ordinance be adopted and passed on its first reading. On roll call voting Aye, Councilmen Johnson, Freeman and Foote. Rogers absent. Carried.
