

OCTOBER 5, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session, October 5, 1951, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers of Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E.W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, and Rogers, Councilman Johnson absent; S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur L. Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of the Meeting held on September 21, 1951, were read and approved as read.

The monthly reports of the various Departments were read by the Clerk. There being no objection, the reports were accepted and ordered placed on file.

The bills against the City for the month of September 1951, having been audited by two members of the Finance Committee were recommended for payment as follows:

(KUNTER ADDITION)

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, DESCRIBING SAID LANDS, AND DECLARING THE SAME A PART OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS.

The above Ordinance was read. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman that the above Ordinance be adopted and passed on its second reading. On roll call voting Aye, 3. Nay, None. Absent one.

Crowder, Master Technician, Police Department, rate of pay equivalent to that of Police Lieutenant; as per recommendations of the Idaho Falls Civil Service Commission, per their minutes of Sept. 19, 1951. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the above appointments be approved. On roll call voting Aye, 3. Nay, None. One absent.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, authorizing the Purchasing Agent, to place an order for new substation and other materials to complete the project of new substation to be erected on the corner of Crowley and Fremont Streets, total cost approximately
