

AUGUST 17, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session August 17, 1951, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Johnson, Rogers and Foote; S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent and Arthur Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of the Meeting held on August 7, 1951, were read and approved as read.

A letter read from the Continental Oil Co., Idaho Falls, Idaho, making application for a drop curb on the south west corner of the North Yellowstone Highway and Poulson Avenue, for driveway entrance to property. ORDINANCE NO. 779

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PARK OR LEAVE UNATTENDED ANY MOTOR VEHICLE ON ANY PRIVATE LOT OR PARCEL OF LAND IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, WITHOUT CONSENT OF THE OWNER OR PERSON IN CHARGE OF SUCH LOT OR PARCEL OF LAND WHEN SUCH LOT OR PARCEL OF LAND IS POSTED; DEFINING A "POSTED" LOT OR PARCEL OF LAND; DEFINING DUTIES OF POLICE OFFICERS UNDER THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE.

The above Ordinance was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the above Ordinance be adopted and passed on its first reading. On roll call voting Aye, Foote, Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. Nay, None. Carried.

A letter was read from Chicago Bridge & Iron Company, Salt Lake City, Utah, dated August 23, 1951, regarding reconditioning and repairing water tank, enclosing Standard Field Force Account Contract. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the application for light and water assistance by Amy Haggard, Jefferson Street, be denied. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

The matter of a pumping platform for the Fire Department on Memorial Drive was referred to the Street and Park Committee.

The Engineer's estimate on the Capital Hill and Highland Park Sewer action was deferred to a later date.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Freeman that the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, accept 50 new meter heads to be loaned to City, and to have reconditioned and repair old meter heads @ \$6.75 each, plus one way transportation. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the plat of LINDEN PARK ADDITION, Division No. 4, R-1 zoning, be accepted and the Mayor is authorized to sign the plat after the City Engineer, Claude Black, has Ok'd the storm sewer provision. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay None. Carried.

The proposition by Jack Pouch for right of way for \$22,000.00 was referred to the Finance Committee.

The Mayor appointed the following Committee to investigate and report back as to establishing City manager-ship in Idaho Falls, Idaho. William Gourley, Aden Hyde, Mrs. B. B. Myers, Jack Goble and Ed Brown.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Council adjourn. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.
