

JULY 20, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session July 20, 1951, at 8 P.M. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Johnson, Rogers and Foote; S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of Meeting held on July 6, 1951 were read and approved.

PETITION TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO

We the undersigned property owners of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, hereby respectfully petition the City to use all means at their disposal to perfect the necessary arrangements to the end that we may have sewers installed to serve our respective properties, through the alley between Boise & Cassia, Blocks 74 & 61. Petition presented by Robert F. Woller and signed by 25 property owners.

The above petition was referred to the Street and Ditch Com. and the City Engineer.

The Meat Inspection report for the month of June was read, and ordered placed on file.

Applications for BARTENDER'S permit, by Harry W. Parker, 270 Sunset, was presented by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote, that the above application be approved and the Clerk instructed to issue the proper permit. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Motion carried.

Petition from Max H. Jensen for re-zoning from Park residence to limited business on property situated in Idaho Falls, County of Bonneville, State of Idaho, described as follows: Beginning at a point 55.42' South of the Northeast corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section Seventeen (17), Township Two (2), North range Thirty-eight (38) E.B.M. thence West 150', thence South 125', thence East 150', thence North 125', to the point of beginning.

This petition was referred to the Appeal Board.

A letter from J. Richard Kennedy, for rezoning on the North $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 10, Block 25, in Scotts Addition, from residential to commercial, was read by the Clerk. This letter referred to the Appeal Board.

A letter read from the Safeway Stores, dated July 19, 1951, regarding leasing a strip of land, 8 feet by 140 feet, adjoining the Robinson property. This letter was referred to the Street and Park Committee.

The following Resolution was read by the Clerk:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the following described portion of the City parking lot, to-wit:

Southerly Eighty (80) feet of Lots Twelve (12) to Twenty (20), inclusive, of Block One (1), Original Town-site of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, per recorded plat thereof,

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is not needed for Municipal purposes and will better serve the needs of the inhabitants of the City if leased to Lost River Transportation Company, a co-partnership, as a terminal base and depot for the City passengers, and

WHEREAS, Lost River Transportation Company, a co-partnership, has offered to lease said premises for a term beginning July 15, 1951, and ending July 14, 1952, with an option to renew said lease for a term beginning July 15, 1952, and ending April 30, 1953, and to pay rent therefore in the sum of \$200.00 per month, and said offer is the highest and best bid for the leasing of said premises.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby, authorized and directed to execute and deliver to Lost River Transportation Company, a co-partnership, a lease of said premises on the terms set forth.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers, that the above proposition for lease be rejected. On roll call, voting Aye, 4. Carried.

A letter was read from Housing and Home Finance Agency, dated July 10, 1951, regarding the Sewer Advance Planning Program. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers, that the agreement be cancelled. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

An application for light and water assistance from Lola Hampton, 310 S. Capital Avenue, was read and referred to the Finance Committee. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Clerk submit a list of bad and doubtful accounts as soon as possible to the Finance Committee for consideration. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

A letter of July 9th, 1951, from the office of the State Auditor, regarding the report of M. W. Humphreys, for the period May 1, 1950 to April 30, 1951 was ordered placed on file.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson, that the old light and water bill of Arty West be cancelled. Also, the bill of R. T. St. John providing, there is no Estate. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

Vets Housing delinquencies referred to Art Smith, City Attorney.

A letter read from the Idaho Falls Ministerial Association, dated July 19, 1951, was ordered placed on file.

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License fee for SOFT DRINKS was referred to the City Attorney.

Mayor Fanning appointed Miss Mae Neuber, as a member of the Idaho Falls Library Board, succeeding Mrs. George P. Bryan, deceased. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the appointment of Miss Neuber be approved. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

Mayor Fanning appointed Spencer Sunblade as Chief Collector for Coin-operated amusement devices. (Slot Machines) It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote that the appointment of Spencer Sunblade be approved. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the service bill for the months of May, June, and July, for the account J-24AB, Ross Corbett, Golf Course, be cancelled. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Carried.
