

JUNE 15, 1951

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The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, met in Regular Session June 15, 1951 at 8 P.M.. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Arthur Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of Meetings held on June 7<sup>th</sup>, June 9<sup>th</sup>, 1951 were read and approved as read.

The following applications for licenses were read:

O. D. Hendrickson, Capital & Broadway, Soft Drink: R. Leroy Collins, Vets Housing No. 2, Journeyman Electrician: Northwest Butane Gas Co. North Highway, renewal of operating gas co. and installing equipment. On motion by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson the above applications for licenses were approved and the City Clerk authorized to issue proper licenses. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

A letter was read from the Pocatello Waste Paper Co., regarding lease on dump grounds for the purpose of salvaging waste paper and other salvage. The Mayor referred the matter to the Health & Sanitation Committee, with power to act.

A letter read from T. C. Wasley, Sec. of the Intermountain Dairy Cattle Congress thanking the Mayor and Council for their cooperation.

A letter read from John Tanner, Big Piney, Wyo. thanking the City for buying his steer, etc.

A letter read from Mrs. Marie Anderson, regarding reduction of Palmistry license fee. On motion by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote the license fee for Palmistry Reading to remain as is. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

A letter from John M. Sharp, attorney, dated June 7<sup>th</sup>, 1951 in behalf of the Eighth Ward of the L.D.S. Church concerning their desire to close the alley from Emerson to Higbee on the block between 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Streets. On motion by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers it was referred to the City Attorney to draw an ordinance for closing this alley. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

The following applications for light and water assistance were read: Mrs. Luella Hill, 211 W. 18<sup>th</sup> Street, and Sarah E. Muncey, 1055 Bear Avenue. The Mayor referred the applications to the Finance Committee for investigation and report.

**RESOLUTION**

On roll call voting Aye, Councilmen Freeman Foote, Rogers and Johnson. Nay, None. All voting in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the Ordinance passed and adopted.

**ORDINANCE NO. 773**  
**ANDERSON-JEPPSON ADDITION AND CANAL**  
**RIGHT OF WAY BETWEEN SAID ANDERSON-JEPPSON**  
**ADDITION AND TEWS ADDITION**

The Mayor announced the resignation of Mr. Chet G. Taylor from the Planning Board; on motion by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Foote the resignation was accepted and a vote of JUNE 15, 1951

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thanks extended to Mr. Taylor for his good work on the Planning Board. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

The Mayor appointed Mr. Harold West as a member of the Planning Board, to succeed Mr. Taylor.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Foote that the appointment of Mr. Harold West as a member of the Planning Board be approved. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Motion carried.

The Mayor announced that the office of Fetzer and Fetzer, architects, advised that the amount necessary to complete the Civic Auditorium to be \$165,000.00, the amount short on present contract is \$34,613.12; Paving, Sidewalks and etc. \$51,891.35; Bond Expense \$2,000.00 and Election, Advertising and etc. \$1,495.53, making a total of \$255,000.00 in order to complete the Auditorium.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Rogers, that the City of Idaho Falls, float a \$255,000.00 Bond Issue, for the purpose of completing the Civic Auditorium and that all necessary steps be taken to perfect the proceedings.

On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None. Motion carried.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 774

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES AS DEFINED BY TITLE 50, CHAPTER 15, IDAHO CODE; CREATING THE OFFICE OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICE LICENSE COLLECTOR, DEFINING HIS DUTIES AND PROVIDING FOR SURETY BOND AND SALARY; PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT COLLECTORS, DEFINING THEIR DUTIES AND PROVIDING FOR SURETY BONDS AND SALARIES; PROVIDING LIMITATIONS ON LICENSES; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF MAXIMUM AND MINIMUM ANNUAL LICENSE FEES FOR THE OPERATION OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES; PROVIDING REGULATIONS AND CONTROLS FOR THE OPERATION OF SAID DEVICES AND LICENSING THE SAME; PROVIDING THE FORM OF LICENSE OR STAMP TO BE OBTAINED AND DISPLAYED THEREFORE AND THE CANCELLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE PRORATING OF LICENSE FEES FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE REVOCATION OF LICENSES AND FOR NOTICE OF HEARING PRECEDING SUCH REVOCATIONS; PROVIDING FOR A SAVING CLAUSE; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The foregoing Ordinance was read by the City Clerk.

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The Reverend Dr. Joseph I. Gullock, Leonard Wright, Worth Wright, Cecil Hart, Howard Price, Joe Armstrong and others spoke in opposition to the slot machines, suggesting referendum vote, cutting the Budget and raising the Tax Levy and etc.

A motion was made by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that since there had developed a definite and concerted opinion among our citizens that revenue from slot machines is not a desirable source of City revenue, I move that the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of the proposed slot machine Ordinance be postponed until July 15<sup>th</sup>. I also move that a citizens committee meet with the Mayor and Council to look over our 1951-1952 budget with an effort to reduce the budget to our estimated Budget Revenue for 1951-1952. On roll call voting Aye, Johnson and Freeman. Nay, Rogers and Foote. The deciding vote against the motion was cast by Mayor Fanning. The motion failed to carry.

It was moved by Councilman Foote and seconded by Rogers that the Ordinance pertaining to coin-operated devices be adopted and passed on its second reading. On roll call voting Aye, Councilmen Foote and Rogers. Nay, Councilmen Freeman and Johnson. The Mayor cast the deciding vote in favor of the motion and declared the motion adopted and passed on its second reading.

There was a motion to adjourn made and seconded. On roll call voting Aye, 4.
