

MARCH 16, 1951

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Session March 16, 1951 at 8:00 P.M. Roll call showed there were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson, and Corbett. Councilman Freeman being absent. The City Clerk, Charles H. Williams also being absent. The minutes were taken by Helen Anderson, assistant to the Clerk.

The minutes of the Meeting held March 6, 1951 were read and it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Corbett that the minutes be approved with one correction showing the appointment of Wayne Clifford to be effective March 1, 1951. Roll call voting Aye, Corbett, Rogers and Johnson. Voting Nay, None; Freeman being absent.

The application of Nora Bells Brown, 143 College, was presented and after discussion it was recommended by the Mayor that Mrs. Brown come to the office for a personal interview.

A letter from the Zoning Committee concerning the South Bel-Aire Addition was read by the Mayor and it was discussed and the plat was studied by the Mayor, the Council and Mr. Black. No action taken.

A refrigerator and compressor belonging to Mark Weaver was discussed as Mr. Weaver wished to sell to the City.

Mr. McCarty requested that he be given a lease or that the City sell to him land at the Airport on which he could build a hangar for large planes. A 99 year lease was discussed on the ground at \$100.00 per year, but no action was taken. There was also a discussion of the Oswald gun range.

ORDINANCE NO. 768

AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING ALL THAT PORTION OF THE ALLEY IN BLOCK SIX OF SOUTH PARK ADDITION TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, LYING AND BEING EAST OF A POINT THAT IS TEN FEET EAST OF THE WEST PROPERTY LINES OF LOTS TWELVE AND THIRTY-SEVEN OF SAID BLOCK SIX, AND A PORTION OF COTTAGE PLACE AS HEREIN DESCRIBED, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE OWNER OF THE ADJACENT REAL ESTATE, AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Corbett that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. It was seconded by Councilman Johnson. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 3; Nay, None. One absent. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 3; Nay, None. One absent.

Fencing of the Idaho Canal was brought up before the Council and it was discussed and agreed that the material for the fence could be purchased from George A. Cope.

There being no further business to come before the Council, it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Rogers that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, 3. One Absent.
